Dresden, April 10, N. S.

THE necessary Orders have been issued by this Court, for a Body of 10,000 Men, appointed to join his Imperial Majesty's Forces in Hungary, to be ready to march by the 10th of next Month. There are to be two Majors-General, two Lieutenants-General, and a General in Chief; and it is not doubted but the latter will be Count Sulkowski, who on that Occasion will be made General of Foot. The Dutchess of Wirtenberg has notified here the Death of the late Duke, and at the same Time that Prince's Will was delivered to his Polish Majesty, who is named one of the Executors thereof. The Vice-Chancellor of Poland, who is lately returned hither from thence, gives a melancholly Account of the great Distress many of the poor Inhabitants in several Parts of that Country were in for want of Provisions to subsist on. The Emperor has obtained Leave of the King of Poland, for the Passage through this Country of two Battalions and a Company of Grenadiers, which the Duke of Wolfenbuttel lends that Prince to serve in Hungary.

Hague, April 16, N. S. M. Bray set out this Morning for France, in order to take upon him the Charge which he had before the late Rupture, of his Polish Majesty's Affairs at that Court.

Whitehall, March 31, 1737.

Whereas Information has been given on Oath, That on Tuesday the 15th Day of this Instant March, between the Hours of Seven and Eight of the Clock in the Evening, Jonathan Linthwait, of the Borough of Leicester, in the County of Leicester, Brazier, being on Horseback in his Way from Melton Mowbray to the said Borough, was assaulted in a Place called Thramaston Lane, in the Parish of Belgrade, in the said County, by three Persons on Horseback, one of whom seized him, and carrying him out of the Road into a Close adjoining to the said Highway, robbed him of the Sum of Twenty four Shillings, or thereabouts, his Horse Whip, and one Eimnen Handkerchief, and afterwards bound him Hand and Foot; and while the said Jonathan Linthwait lay bound, the said three Highwaymen robbed and bound several other Persons near that Place, and took from them in Goods and Money to the Value of Fourteen Pounds: For the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Robberies, his Ma-

jesty is pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so as he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof. **HOLLES NEWCASTLE.**

Description of the Persons above-mentioned.

One of them appeared to be about Five Foot Eleven Inches high, a jolly Man, of a ruddy Complexion, wore his own Hair, had on a light Drab Coat, double-breasted, with white Metal Buttons; another about Five Foot Eight Inches high, pitted with the Small Pox, and wore a brown Wig, and a brown Coat and red Waist-coat; and the third, a tall Man in a shabby Dress, with long black Hair and a yellowish or fallow Complexion: The Horses on which they rode, were a Sorrel, a dark Chestnut, and a Bay Horse, with a Star and a Snip on his Nose, and a short switch Tail, and each of them a black Lift down their Backs.

Whitehall, April 1, 1737.

Whereas about Six Months ago, a Paper was affixed to the House of Mr. Ridge, Keeper of the Forrest in the Isle of Wight, threatening, That if he should take away any Gun, or hurt any Man for killing Deer out of their own Grounds or Corn, his Horse would be shot under him, and his Habitation laid low about his Ears, and to remember the Walton Blacks, for there would rise Forty Men in Arms against him in a little time; And whereas several Deer have since been killed and destroyed in the said Forrest, and on Sunday the 6th of February last, about Twelve o' Clock at Night, a Gun loaded with Slugs was discharged in at one of the Chamber Windows of the Dwelling House of the said Mr. Ridge, in which Chamber he was at that Time a Bed, with an Intent, as there is Reason to believe, to kill him, for that the Slugs went through the Bed Curtains, and lodged in the Chimney-piece of the said Chamber: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in so heinous a Crime, is pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so as he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof. And as a further Encouragement, His Majesty is also pleased to promise a Reward of Fifty Pounds to any one of them, or to any other Person or Persons, who shall make such Discovery as aforesaid, to be paid upon the Conviction of the Offender or Offenders. **HOLLES NEWCASTLE.**
