Vienna, April 24, N. S.

THE Emperor named Yesterday four new Feldt Marshals, viz. the Duke of Aremberg, Count Seckendorf, Count Philippi, and Count Kevenhuller. Baron Berenklaue arrived here the 22d Instant from Petersbourg, having desired to serve in the Emperor's Army instead of being employed in that of the Czarina. As he has been a whole Month upon the Road, he has brought nothing new from thence, except the repeated Instances of the Czarina for the Emperor's entering into the War as soon as possible. The first Courier from the Turkish Camp will probably fix the Resolutions of this Court; but in the mean while they seem now entirely persuaded that the War is unavoidable.

Copenhagen, April 30, N. S. To Day the King of Denmark reviews the Regiment of Grenadiers, together with the Body of Artillery, and on Thursday the Foot Guards, with Colonel Sturop's Regiment; after which the Royal Family is to remove into the Country, and will probably pass the Summer in this Island, there being no Talk at present of any farther Progress.

Dresden, May 1, N. S. Count Sulkowski is declared General of Foot in the Saxon Troops, and is to command the auxiliary Troops his Majesty sends to serve against the Turks in Hungary; the Count de Keyserstein is arrived here in quality of the Emperor's Commissary, to regulate the March of these Saxon Troops through Bohemia.

Hague, May 7, N. S. The States of Holland are to assemble here To-morrow, chiefly as is laid on occasion of the Grievances complained of relating to the Treaty of Commerce with France, and a Negotiation is said to be set on foot with that Court, in order to redress those Grievances. The Troops of the States are in March every where to exchange their Garrisons; the Foot Guards arrived here last Friday, and the Swiss march'd from hence the next Day for Tournay, their appointed Garrison. Count Uhlfeldt, the Emperor's Minister, is renewing his Solicitations with the respective Members of the States of Holland, to obtain from their Assembly the Guaranty of a new Loan demanded by the Emperor. The French Ambassadour M. de Fenelon, is expected to return hither from Paris by the 14th Instant. The Spanish Ambassadour, delivered Yesterday to the States, Don Carlos's Letter upon his Accession to the Crown of Naples and Sicily. There were some Difficulties in the Style of the Letter, which were adjusted as much as possible with that Ambassadour in order to the Recognition of that King, and a Deputation of the States was sent to him thereupon this Day.
