HE Emperor named Yesterday four new Feldt Marshals, viz. the Duke of Aremberg, Count Seckendorf, Count Philippi, and Count Kevenhuller. Baron Berenklau arrived here the 22d Instant from Petersbourg, having defired to ferve in the Emperor's Army inftead of being employ-As he has been a ed in that of the Czarina. whole Month upon the Road, he has brought nothing new from thence, except the repeated Instances of the Czarina for the Emperor's entring into the War as foon as possible. The first Courier from the Turkish Camp will probably fix the Refolutions of this Court; but in the mean while they feem now entirely perfuaded that the War is unavoidable.

Copenhagen, April 30, N. S. To Day the King of Denmark reviews the Regiment of Grenadiers, together with the Body of Artillery, and on Thursday the Foot Guards, with Colonel Sturop's Regiment; after which the Royal Family is to remove into the Country, and will probably pais the Summer in this Island, there being no Talk at prefent of any farther Progrefs.

Drefden, May 1, N. S. Count Sulkowski is declared General of Foot in the Saxon Troops, and is to command the auxiliary Troops his Majesty fends to serve against the Turks in Hungary; the Count de Keyserstein is arrived here in quality of the Emperor's Commiffary, to regulate the March of these Saxon Troops through Bohemia.

Hague, May 7, N. S. The States of Hol-land are to affemble here To-morrow, chiefly as is laid on occasion of the Grievances complained of relating to the Treaty of Commerce with France, and a Negotiation is faid to be fet on foot with that Court, in order to redrefs those Grievances. The Troops of the States are in March every where to ex-change their Garrifons; the Foot Guards arrived here last Friday, and the Swifs march'd from hence the next Day for Tournay, their appointed Garrifon. Count Uhlfeldt, the appointed Garrifon. Count Uhlfeldt, the Emperor's Minister, is renewing his Solicitations with the respective Members of the States of Holland, to obtain from their AL fembly the Guaranty of a new Loan demand-ed by the Emperour. The French Ambaffa-dour M. de Fenelon, is expected to return hither from Paris by the 14th Instant. The Spanish Ambassadour, delivered Yesterday to the States, Don Carlos's Letter upon his Acceffion to the Crown of Naples and Sicily. There were some Difficulties in the Style of the Letter, which were adjusted as much as possible with that Ambasizdour in order to the Recognition of that King, and a Depu-tation of the States was sent to him thereupon this Day.
