HAT Part of the Ruffiad Army which is to be commanded by Felt-Marshal Count Munich, and which is to confift, fome fay of 70, and others affirm 90,000 regular Troops; befides a vaft Number of Tartars, Collacks, and Calmucks, is in full March to allemble at Zaritzinka; and it is generally believed here, that the Felt Marshal defigns very foon to beliege Oczakow on the Mouth of the River Nie-per, to try to engage the Grand Vizier to come to a Battle in order to relieve that Place. All the Amazunition and Provisions for the Army are to be carried down the Nieper by the Boats that have been built this Winter at Bransky. The other Part of the Ruffian Army, that is to be commanded by Felt-Marshal Lacy, and which is faid to confift of 40,000 regular Troops, belides Tartars and Collacks, is allembling at Illum on she River Donetz, and is to: attack the Crimea, at the fame time that a great Number of Boats, which have been built this Winter at Taurof on the River Don, ate to carry other Troops over the Sea of Aloph, and attack alfo-that Country.
