Petersbourg, May 21, O. S.

HE last Advices from Felt Marshal Count Munich were dated the 4th Instant, by which this Court is acquainted, that he had received a Letter from the Turkish Plenipotentiaries, by which they informed him that they were arrived on the Borders, and defired a Guard to convoy them to Cudak; that he had answered this Letter, and advised them not to go to Cudak, but to Bialazerkoff, which is a neutral Place belonging to the Republick of Poland: But it does not appear that this Court is yet informed whether the Turkish Plenipotentiaries are gone to Bialazerkoff, or whether they wait on the Frontiers for new Orders from the Grand Vizier before they follow Count Munich's Advice. That Count writes likewise, that all the Troops under his Command were advanced to the Nieper near Perevolotchna, and encamped about eight Miles from thence, where they waited for some Artillery from Breansky, and as feen as that is arrived it is thought he will proceed on his March to besiege Oczakow. By this Time it is thought the Czarina's Plenipotentiaries, Baron Shaphiroff, and M. Neplueff, are very near Kioff, if not arrived there: M. Volenski being Sick is still here, but it is faid he designs to set out this Even-

Berlin, June 22, N. S. This Day at Noon his Prussian Majesty received an Account by Express, that the States of Courland having allembled on the 11th Instant, chose on the 13th Count Biron, the Czarina's Grand

Chambellan, for their Duke.

Hague, June 28, N. S. M. Vilvliet, the Fiscal of the Admiralty of Zealand, who was named to be the third Commissary of this State for the Tariff to be settled with the Low Countries, is fince dead; upon which Occasion it has been thought proper by their High Mightinesles, to have a new Election of three Committaries; that Zealand shall name another Commissary in their Fiscal's Room; that Holland shall have the Nomination of another, and the States General of the third; and it is not doubted but M. Hop, and M. Assendelft, first intended for that

Commission, will be confirmed. The States General have likewise named three Deputies to go to Embden, in order to contribute, by all fort of amicable Means, to the Succels of the Agreement now on foot between the Magistrates of that Town, and the Prince of Oost Frise. The States of Holland who separated on the 22d Instant, are summoned to re-affemble here next Wednesday Seven-night. Sixteen Ships of the East India Fleet are arrived in the respective Ports of these Pro-vinces, and the rest are daily expected.

St. James's, June 25. This Day the four Troops of Horse Guards, and the two Troops of Horse Grenadier Guards, passed in Review before his Majesty in Hyde Park, and made a very fine Appearance. After which their Majesties, with his Royal Highness the Duke, and their Royal Highnesses the Princesses, went to Richmond to refide there for fome Time.

His Majesty has also been pleased to con-flitute and appoint John Duke of Montagu to be Captain and Colonel of the First Troop of Horse Guards, in the Room of John Earl of Westmorland; And also to constitute and appoint Francis Earl of Estingham to be Captain and Colonel of the Second Troop of Hosse Grenadier Guards, in the Room of Brigadier General Berkeley, deceased.

The King has been pleased to constitute Sir William Chapple, Kt. one of his Majefty's Serjeant at Law, one of the Justices of the Court of King's Bench, in the Room of Sir William Lee, Kt. now Lord Chief Justice of the said Court.

His Majesty has likewise been pleased to appoint Thomas Pipon, Esq; to be Keeper of his Majetty's Game in the Island of Jeriey.
