THE 4th of this Month his Polish Majesty arrived at Fraustadt. On the 7th the Turkish Minister arrived there, the Palatin of Kiovia having conducted him within a few Miles of that Place, before the Order from the King arrived for his going to Warsaw, therefore his Majesty could not refuse seeing him without greatly disobliging the Porte; besides which, the Poles were desirous he should be treated with Distinction; and M. Keyserling, the Russian Minister, who opposed his being received at Fraustadt, was at last prevailed on to consent to it.
