OME Days ago this Court was informed by the Hospodar of Moldavia, that the Turkish Plenipotentiaries, and M. Tahlman had taken Leave of the Grand Vizier the 18th of April, and were to set out the next Day in order to go to Cudak, where they would wait till the Russian Plenipotentiaries arrived on the Borders, and a Place for holding the Congress agreed on. M. Volenski, one of the Russian Plenipotentiaries, it is said, will set out Tomorrow or the Day following; and Count Ostein is to follow next Week.

Vienna, June 1, N. S. On the 30th past the Emperour declared publickly, that he had constituted the Duke of Lorrain Generalissimo of his Army in Hungary, and his Royal Highness will be going very soon to put himself at the Head of those Troops. Field Marshal Count Kevenhuller set out on the 20th, as did Field Marshal Count Seckendors on the 30th, and Yesterday the Prince of Saxe Hildbourghausen. It is expected, that as soon as the Generals arrive at their respective Posts, the military Operations will be begun.

Stockholm, May 24, O. S. M. Utterodt, Minister from the King of Poland, having received his Letters of Revocation from his Master, has taken his Audience of Leave of the King and Queen of Sweden, and proposes to set out in a few Days on his Return to Dresden.
