*Petersbourg, May 14, O. S.*

**S**OME Days ago this Court was informed by the Hospodar of Moldavia, that the Turkish Plenipotentiaries, and M. Tahlman had taken Leave of the Grand Vizier the 18th of April, and were to fet out the next Day in order to go to Cudak, where they would wait till the Russian Plenipotentiaries arrived on the Borders, and a Place for holding the Congress agreed on. M. Volenski, one of the Russian Plenipotentiaries, it is said, will fet out Tomorrow or the Day following; and Count Ostein is to follow next Week.

*Vienna, June 1, N. S.* On the 30th past the Emperour declared publickly, that he had constituted the Duke of Lorrain Generalissimo of his Army in Hungary, and his Royal Highness will be going very soon to put himself at the Head of those Troops. Field Marshal Count Kevenhuller fet out on the 29th, as did Field Marshal Count Seckendorf on the 30th, and Yesterday the Prince of Saxe Hildbourghausen. It is expected, that as soon as the Generals arrive at their respective Posts, the military Operations will be begun.

*Stockholm, May 24, O. S.* M. Utterodt, Minister from the King of Poland, having received his Letters of Revocation from his Master, has taken his Audience of Leave of the King and Queen of Sweden, and proposes to fet out in a few Days on his Return to Dresden.

And as a further Encouragement, the said Beaupre Bell, Esq; of Beaupre Hall, near Wisbeech, in the County of Norfolk, does hereby promise a Reward of Fifty Pounds to any one of the Persons concerned in the said Facts, or to any other Person or Persons who shall make such Discovery as aforesaid; to be paid upon the Conviction of the Offender or Offenders.
