TIELD Marshal Count Seckendorff is to command the main Army against the Turks, and Prince Hildburgshaufen the separate Army which is to act The former set out from hence on Thursday Morning last for Croatia, where he is to visit all the fortified Places, and be at his Army near Belgrade about the Middle of this Month, at which Time it is supposed he may hear of Marshal Munich's having entred upon Action, and then he will immediately advance into the Turkish Territories without waiting for any farther Orders from hence. Prince Hildburg-shausen set out Yesterday, and is to begin the military Operations in Bosnia as soon as he hears from Count Seckendorff that the Muscovites have done the same on their Side. Count\_Wilsheck, who was the Emperour's Ambassadour in Poland at the late Election, and who is now appointed to be the Emperour's first Plenipotentiary at the ensuing Congress with the Turks, is upon the Point of fetting out.

Berlin, June 8, N. S. According to our Advices from Dresden, the King of Poland will, when he comes to Fraustadt, where he is expected on the 10th of next Month, sign the Universalia for the Meeting of the States of Courland, in order to their proceeding to the Election of a new Duke, pursuant to the Constitutions passed by the last General Diet of Pacification. The Duke and Dutchess of Brunswick arrived here on Sunday last, and the Tuesday following the King of Prussia made the General Review of the 20 Battallions which draw together here every Year for that Purpose. His Prussian Majesty is at present taken up in viewing every Day one of

the said Regiments singly.
