Harwich, March 8. Is Majesties Ship the Revenge, forced about a forthnight fince, by the violence of the Storm to the Northward, as far as to very near fixty degrees, in her Return home, falling in with fome few Dutch Doggers, fishing upon the Dogger Bank, took two of them, and is now paffing by towards the River.

Tripoly, Oct. 28. Here is fitting out the Aquila Coronata, a Ship taken lately from the Venetians, and is to carry above 30 Guns, as l'kewile eight other Velleis, ou of which a e o carry, from to to 50 Guns, and t of r a, from 12 to 30. There is alfo upon the Stocks a new Ship of 44 Guns, which will quickly be in a readiness to go to Sea. The 6 instant 5 of our Ships niet with Monsieur Temericourt aKnight of Maltha, in a Ship of 38 Guns, in the Gulf of Candia, t vo of them engaged him for two days together, but they found fo brave a refistance, that they were forced to leave him at last, when he had but seven Barrels of Powder left in all The next night after our Ships arrived in Port, the Malthefe by the Ignorance or Treachery of his Pilot, a Greek, was run aground 100 Miles to the East ward of this place, when he thought he had been to the Westward of Maltha ; the Cavaller, with 150 Christians more, is brought hither, and 30 Turks found on board him, are fet at liberty.

Prague, Feb. 13. The States of this Kingdom were summoned to affemble on Monday last, to hear what the Emperor would propole to them. There has been lately much milchief done in fome parts of this Countrey by violent Winds and Storms, accompanied with extraordinary Lightnings; many Houses having been burnt down, and many Trees forced up by the Roots. From saxony we hear that his Electoral Highnels is raising 12 Regiments very speedaly.

Tric , Feb. 19. The Baron Hennequin is removed from Nancy to Metz, in order, as is said, to his being fent to Paris, upon fulpition of his having held correspondence with the Duke de Lorrain. Some days fince about 1000 or 1200 French Horle paffed through this place, and report that they are to be shortly followed by 600 more. Munfter Feb. 28. It is found upon examination,

that the Baron Jan Adam Kett is the principal Perfon that has k pt correspondence with the Governor, of this place and others, to induce them to deliver up the Town to the Imperial Forces, and tokill, or at leaft to deliver the Bishop up prisoner to them,

Hildesbaim, Fcb. 29. The Imperialists are alrea-dy arrived here, and we daily expect the Brandenburgh Forces should follow them in their return to Halberfladt.

Hambrough, March 3. By Letters from Warfam of the 22 of February, we understand, that the Turks had leiled the Callle of Chocim in Walachy, and had put 200 Janilaries into it for a Garrilon together with 20 pieces of Gannon , transported thither from Caminiec : Further, that the Infidels intend to Garrison all the places of the thring for

fecuring their paffage through that Province. From Stockholm we hear, that Monfieur Crofeck , Envoy of the Elector of Brandenburg, was arrived there, together with the Envoy of Heffen Darmstad, and were gone to Upfal, where the Court then was; and that the Envoy of Muscowy was departed thence. From Minden we are told, that the greatest part of the Brandenburg Troops are lately come to quarter in that Diocefs, on both fides of the Weger, his Electoral Highness having left a sufficient sorce as he thinks behind him, for the defence of Lipstadt and Sparenburgh, the onely two places now in his poffestion, in all the Countrey of Mark. The Imperialists are, 'tis faid, to be lodged in the Bishoprick of Hilde fheim. The Princes of the Houle of Brunfwick and Lunenburgh , are bulie in gathering their Troops together, to have them in a readiness upon all occasions.

Wesel, March 9. There are larely come into the Countrey of Cleves, several numbers of French, both Foot and Horse, under the Count de Lorge, and other French Commanders, who are lodged about Goch. 'Tis faid the Duke of Luxemburgh 15 marching this way in Perfon from Utrecht, with Teveral Regiments under his Command upon what design is not known, unles it be to posses themselves of Calcan, the only place remaining in the hands of the Elector of Brandenburgh in all h s. Dutchy of aleves, nor is that of any great confideration, except only for the Cittadel, which is reputed of indifferent ftrong. Sunday last the Garrison was reinforced with some Troops of fresh Horse, and the next day soo Foot were lent into the Town.

Cologne, March 10. Several French Troops, are gone to refresh themselves for some time in the Countrey of Byffelt, and our last advices from Metz, inform us, that there was a confiderable Body of Men, ready to be embarked upon the Mofelle, to be fent down towards this place.

Paris March 9. His Majesty relolving to keep three Armies on foot this next Summer one in the low Countreys, a fecond about Utrecht, and any other in Germany; the first to be Commanded by himself in Person, has named for Lieutenant Gens, rals, the Duke de Feuillade, the Count de Lorge, and the Marquis de Rochefort ; to the fecond, under the Command of the Prince, the Duke his Son, and the Duke of Luxemburgh under him ; to the third, under the Command of the Mareshal de Turenne, the Counts de Soisons, de Guiche, and du Lude together with the Sieurs de Foucanit, and St. Abre. Monsieur de Naussille is laid to be appointed to Command a Body of Forces in Lorrain, for the fecurity of those parts.

Ditto, 14. Don Ayala is within thefe three days arrived here from Spain, to condole with their Ma-jesties npoh the death of the young Duke of Anjou lately déceated, having brought with him a Prefent of Guns from the King his Master to the Dauphin, one whereof hath the Stockster with Diamonds to a great value. Newport, March 12.
