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Harmich, Marsb 8.

HIs Majefties Ship the Revenge, forced about a forthright fince, by the violence of the Storm to the Northward, as far as to very near fixty degrees. in her Return bome, faling in with fome few Dutch Doggers, fifhing upon the Dogger Bank, took two of them, and is now paffing by towards the River.
Tripoly, OZF. 28. Here is fitting out the Aquila -Caronata, a Ship raken lately from the Venetians, and is to carry above $\mathbf{j o}$ Guns, as 1 kewile eight other Velfeis, ,u of whichate o cairy, fromato to so Guis, and $r$ of $r$ as $f$ om 12 to 30 . There is zifoupon the Stocks a new Ship of 44 Guns, which will quickly be in a readinefs to go to Sea. The 6 inftants of our Ships met with Monfieur Temericourt aKnight of Malth,, , in a Ship of 38 Guns, in the Gulf of Candia, tro of them engaged him for two days together, but they found fo brave a refiftance, that they were forced to leave himat la $t$, when he had but feven Barrek of Powder left in all The next night after our Ships arrived in Port, the Malthefe by the Ignorance or Treachery of his Pilot, a Greek, was run aground 100 Miles to the Eaft ward of this place, when he thought he had been so the Weltward of Miltha; the Cavalier, with 190 Chriltians more, is broughe hither, and 30 Turks found on board him, are fet at liberty.

Pragite, Feb. 13. The States of this Kingdom were fummored to affemble on Monday laft, to hear what the Emperor would propole to them. There has been lately much mifchief done in fome parts of this Countrey by violent Wirds and Storms, accompanied with extraordinary Lightnings; many Houfes having been burnt down, and many Trees forced up by the Rents. From Saxony we hear that his Electural Highnefs is raifing 12 Regiments very fpeedily.

Tric $\boldsymbol{r}, \mathrm{Fc}$. 19. The Baron Hennequin is removed from Nancy to Metर, in order, as is faid, to his being fent to Paris, upon fufpition of his having held carrefpondence with the Duke de Lorraina Some days fince about 1000 or 1200 French Horle paffed through this piace, and report that they are to be fhortly followed by 600 more.

Munfter Feb. 28. It is found upon examination, that the Baron fan Adam Kett is the privcipal Perion that has $k$ pe correlpondence with the Governor, of this place and others, to induce them to deliver up the Town to the Imperial Forces, and tokill, or at leaft to deliver the Bithop up priforter to them,

Hild $\subset$ hyim, Fcb. ${ }^{2} 9$. The Imperialifts are alrea dy arrivedhere, and we daily expect the Brandenburgh Forces thould follow them in their return to Haiberltadt.

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Hambrotugh, March 3. By Eetters from Whar danp of the 22 of eifebruary , we inderltand, that the Turks had leifed the Cafte of chocim in watacky? and foud putyoo Janilaries into io for a Garrifonis together with 20 plicess $6 f$ Gannon', trampored thither from Caminiec : Further, that the Infidels intend to Garrifon all the placesp of thealuraite fir
fecuring their paffage through that Province. From Stockbolm we hear, that Monfieur Crofech, Envoy of the Elector of Brandenburg, was arrived thert, together with the Envoy of Heffen Darmflad, and were gone to $u_{p} f a l$, where the Courtithen wass and that the Envoy of Mufcouy was departed thence. From dinden we are told, that the greateft part of the Brandenburg Troops are lately come to quarter in that Diocefs, on both fides of the $W^{\prime \prime}$ eqer, his Electoral Highnefs having left a lufficient force as he thinks behind him, for the defence of Lipfladt and sparenburgh, the onely two places now in bis poffeffion, in all the Countrey of Mark. The Iroperialifts are, 'tis faid, to be lodged in the Bimoprick of Hildefheim. The Princes of the Houle of Brunfzosick and Lunenburgh, are bufie in gathering their Troops togethet, to have them in a readinefs apon all occafions.

Wefel, March 9 . There are larely come into the Countrey of Cleves, \{everal numbers of French, both Foot and Horfe, under the Count de Lorge, and other French Commanders, who are lodged about Goch.'Tis !aid the Duke of Luxemburgh ia marching this way in Perfon trom $\boldsymbol{H}$ tracht, with leveral Regiments under his Command upop what defign is agt known, unlefs it be to poffefs themfelves of catcan, the ouly place remanitig in the bands of the Elector of Brandenburgh in atl $h$ s. Dutchy of aleves, nor is that of any great confsderation, except only for the Cittidel, which is reputed of indifferent Atrong. Sunday laft the Garrifon was reinforced with fome Troops of frefh $H$ rfe, and the next day $5 \infty$ Foot were lent into the Town.

Cologne, March 1o. Several French Troops are gone to refrefh themfelves for fome time in the Couns. trey of Eyffelt, and our lait advices from Metz inform us, that there was a confiderable Body of Men, ready to be embarked upon the Mofelle, to he fent down towards this place.

Parion March 9. His Majefty relolving to keep three Armiess on foot this next Summer one in the low Countreys, a fecond about Utrecht, and ant other in Germany; the firft to be Commanded by himfelf in Perfoh, has named for Leentenant Gen67 rals, the Dake de Feuillade, the Count de Zorge, and the Marquis de Rochefort; to the fecord, under the Command of the Prince, the Duke his Son, and the Duke of Luxemburgh undet him; to the third under the Command of the Marefhal de Turenne? the Counts de Soi Sons, de Gutcbe, ant du l.ude together with the Sieurs de Foucatit, and $s_{5 \text {, }}$ Abre. Monfieur de Navatlle is faid to be appointed to Command a Body of Forces in Lotrain, for the fecurity of thofe parts.
Ditto, w. Don sfyala is within thefe theee days arrived here from Spain, to condole with their Majefties apoh the death of the yourg Duke of Anfou Sately deceated, having brought with him a Prefent of Guns from the King his Mafter to the Dauphin, one whereof hath ohe Stocklet with Diamonds to: great value. Here is frif inquifition making, for the finding out of fuch Lands as being at firft given to Hofpitals and Military Orders, have been
filce annexed to Atbies and Priories, or othër Religious Houfes, and the reforing them to their Primitive ules, uniting them all under the Order of St. Lazares, for the maintenance of maimed and aged Soldiers, and Officers that have walled their Eitates in his Majefties lervice; 'ris thought there will by this means be railed a flock of fix Millions r Liures per annum for that purpofe. Monfitur de Lowis voy is Grand Malter of the Order, and feveral Affemblies have been already held underhim; all the Knights are to be of his Majefties chooling, except ooly fuch as are of the Order already. The Prince of Conde's Equipage is already ${ }^{\circ}$ parted towards Nimmegen, and he bimfelf will ftrortly follow. From Romethey write, that the Cardinal Borromeo is lately dead there, fo that now there are five places roid in the Colledge.

Midadeburgh, March 16 . We are here and in $H D l$. cund making ready our Flest in good carneft, and refolve to have it out by the end of April; and though our Men are not yet very formard to come into the lervice, we think that ad increafe of theiry $\mathrm{p}^{2 y}$ (which is refolved) will be a Atrang motive to bring then in in greater numbers hereafter. We bear ehat thofe of Rozeerdian are refolved to fortif ty their Town, and are getting to that end Sub. feriptions, in order to the making of a ftock to car: ry oas that work, tawards which, the Lords have ak. reudy tudvanced 12000 l. Aterling. The generality 4 rakerecople here were in hopes of a Peace a bur re late preparations have banilhed shole thoughts, at fome fittle mifundet landings, which we are bo made believe are, between the King of Engiand anff his Parliament, pur them in hopes that they thalf gain fome odvantage by it; befides, that the report of the thking of Munfter, bad par new life inta es for the prefent, and pailed fo far for affured, that Ballads made after our fabion of wir, upon that orreafion, have been frog up and down in the freets thefe these or four days. Our Capers are ftopt as theg come in, by the Srates Orders, they intending to make ufe of the Seamen on board the Fleet. We are farther in hopes of having ro00 Seamen and 10 Stips from Denmart, fo that in all probability we fhath appear with good Arength at Sea this Summer. A Part of our Burgers are come from Calant; but the Governor of Sluys hath flaved the Burgers there, till others come to relieve them. But'tis believed, eurt Burgers will go forth no more. ihere being not one Souldier in all the Illand of Walcbeyen. forthat we thall need our own Men to defend us, efpecially fince by a Srates Meflenger, yeflerday arrized here from the Hagae we underfand, that there is no likelyhood yet of any Garrifon to be fent to us hi. ther.

Newport, March 12. From Flubing we are iold, that there went out thence 8 Capers this laft week, and as many more are preparing to fer out, fo that that Inland alnne is thought to have no lefs thea 200 Capors at Sea at this time; that norwithfanding the fop made of all Capers as ther come in; thole that had Revicusalled, are fuffered to go out again for fome time. That thete is a Privateer fitting up in that Port, to carry 36 Guns and 200 Men, defigned far St. Helent, to cruife thereabouts. That certain men of War and a Firefhip, are gone towards sureadm, with orders to touch at Virginis in their Returs.

Hague, March 9. The States of Holland, contraiv to their former refolutions, of not meeting till the is inftant, were affembled again yefterday. It cannot be lone ere we hear of their final Refolutions totching our Naval preparations, the Commifio..
ncrs of the Admiralties very diligerely and conflart: ly conferting about the matter. The Field. Mandiall Wurts, the Counts of Hornand Fledorf, together with many other Principal Officers, are arrived here within thefe two days, and yellerday were to artend his Highnefs, boith before and after norn; Prince Maurits is hourly exprtied liere, and 'ris faid, that then there will be a folemn meterng of the Great Officers, to confider of the belt way for the carrying on the War this Senmmer, and particulayly by Land.
