HE last Accounts this Court has received from Felt Marshal Munich were dated the 15th paft; at that Time the Ruffian Troops had not yet paffed the River Bog, except a Party of Saporogue and Don Collacks, which fwam crofs the fame, to chafe a Body of Tartars that appeared on the other Side but retired at their Approach ; Count Munich does not know if those Tartars are retired towards Bender or Oczakow. A Ruffian Enginier, difguifed as a Tartar, who had found Means to get into Oczakow, where he ftayed ten Days, is returned to the Army, and has given Felt Marshal Munich an exact Plan of the Place, which will be of great Service to him when he comes to form the Siege of the Town. This Court expects to hear in eight Days, that Count Munich has paffed the Bog and arrived before Oczakow, unless the Turk's advance and hazard a Battle to prevent the Siege, which may possibly happen, fince this Court is informed that a Seraskier and ieven Bashas have passed the Danube with about 70;000 Men. As Felt Marshal Munich allures her Majeity that the Troops under his Command are in perfect Health, and that he has great Plenty of Provilions and Ammunition, this Ministry seem not to doubt, but that he will be able to give a good Account of the Turks in case they come to an Engagement. The Courier reports, that he met not far from the Bog, a Body of 8000 Russians, with a great Quantity of Artillery and Provisions that were marching to join Count Munich. We have Advices here, that Baron Tahlman, the Emperor's Ambuladour at the Ottoman Porte, and the Turkish Plenipotentiary; had passed the Niester in order to go to Niemerof; but being informed that a Party of Heydamaguis (who are Polish Banditi) had placed them-Telves on the Road with a Defign to rob them, they had been obliged to return to Soroka, where they would wait till those Vagabonds were retired, or till the Crown General of Poland thould fend them a Guard to convoy them to Niemerof,
