*Petersbourg, July 16.*  
**A** Courier arrived here on the 9th Instant, with Letters from Felt Marshal Lacy, dated the 28th of June, who informs her Czarish Majesty, that Vice Admiral Bredal, with the Flottilla coasting the Palus Mæotis, had found a Neck of Land about Thirty Hours Distance from the Perecop, which reached almost to the Crimea; so that with the Assistance of a Bridge of Boats of 30 Fathom long, the Felt Marshal in three Days Time passed all his Army into the Crimea, without going to the Perecop, which he heard was very well repaired and defended by the Chain and his Tartars. That General adds, that as soon as he was got into the Crimea, he was told there was a Line drawn near Arabat, which was guarded by Ten thousand Janissaries, and Five thousand Spahis; which he no sooner heard, than he sent the Hettman of the Don Cossacks, called Effremoff, and some Calmucks to attack them: The Turks made but a very weak Resistance and retired; so that the Cossacks and Calmucks passed the Lines and took several Thousand Horses, Black Cattle, and Sheep, and returned to the Russian Camp after having burnt about twenty Villages. The Russian Plenipotentiaries being informed that M. Tahlman and the Turkish Ministers were arrived within six Hours Journey of Niemeroff, they immediately set out from Kioff to join them. Count Ostein was also to leave that Place on the 6th Instant to follow the said Russian Plenipotentiaries. Councillor Munich writes, that a Courier was arrived at Peterhoff, who brought an Account, that his Brother Felt-Marshal Count Munich had taken Oczakow the 2d Instant.

*Dresden, Aug. 7, N. S. M. Keyserling,*  
 The Russian Minister here, received Yesterday a Courier from Count Munich, with the News of his having taken Oczakow. It is likewise reported, that the Russian Plenipotentiaries are now arrived at Niemeroff. This Court is at present much taken up in making several Rescripts for Courland, and especially that which they call *De Obedientia*, by which the King will order the States of Courland to acknowledge and obey Count Biron as their Duke. The King of Poland has given the Order of the White Eagle to the Duke of Saxe Meyningen.
