E have an Account, that the Turks being informed the Prince of Saxe Hildburgfhaufen had embarked his Infantry on the Save, and ordered his Horfe to march by Land to join the grand Army of the Imperialists, the Turks drew together a great Number of Troops to intercept him; but after fome Difpute the Turks were forced to betake them-

ielves to Hight with the Lofs of 3000 Men. Hague, Sept. 13, N. S. We have re-ceived from Petersbourg a printed Account of the Succeffes of the Ruffian Army commanded by Felt Marshal Lacy, from the 23d of July to the 4th of August, the chief Particulars of which are. That on the faid 23d of July the Felt Marshal being advanced within 29 Versts of the Town of Bassar, was attacked by a confiderable Body of Tartars led by the Chan in Person, but after a short Dispute the Tartars fled towards the Mountains, and were purfued 15 Verfts by the Coffacks and Calmucks, who killed a great Number of them. mucks, who killed a great Number of them. my retired with great Lois. On the 4th the On the 25th, Lieuter ant General Count Felt Marshal passed the said River with the Douglass advanced to x ards Baffar with 61401 Dragoons and Foot, and was followed by the Felt Marshal with all the reft of the Army. Being come in Sight of the Town, they faw a Body of Turkish Troops posted on a rifing Ground near it, confifting, as Prifoners reported, of 12 or 15000 Men; two Regiments of Dragoons, with all the Collacks and Calmucks of the Army, were ordered to attack that Body, and pollefs themfelves of Ballar. They routed the Turks, took the Town, plundered it, fet it on Fire and laid it all in Afhes : There were in it 38 Maho-metan Chapels, two Greek and Armenian Churches, 27 Magazines, 50 Water Mills, above 10000 Houfes, and many publick Buil-dings, most of them of Stone. The Booty was very great, the Inhabitants, of whom a great Number were put to the Sword, having no Time to lave their Effects. On the 26th, the Army having retired from the Mountains about Baffar, and defcended into the Champian Country towards Rama-jem, perceived a Body of about 70,000 of the Enemy advancing on the other Side of the River Karafs : A Detachment of fome Regiments of Foot and Dragoons, with the Collacks and Calmucks were ordered to pass the River and engage them, which was done, and the Enemy were forced to retire with

great Lols. Among the Prifoners were two of their Mursas or chief Leaders. The Felt Marshal spent from the 26th of July to the ift of August in marching from the Karals to the Mouth of the River Sangurski; and in the Country all along to the Right and Left of the Route he took, he caufed all the Villages of the Tartars, amounting in Number to above 1000, the Country being well peopled on that Side, to be burnt to the Ground; and above 60000 Head (f Cattle and Sheep were brought into his Camp. The Enemy in feveral Bodies endeavoured to harrais the Army in this March, but were constantly repulsed with no more Loss to the Ruffians in those fix Days than of Fifty Men killed and wounded. On the 2d of August Part of the Army passed the Sangurski. A confiderable Body of Tartars appeared, which had been reinforced by 2000 Turks Foot and Horfe from Caffa, as Priloners re-ported. A Detachment of fome Regiments of Foot and Dragoons being ordered against them, after four Hours cannonading, the Enereft of the Army, deligning to halt fome Days in that Part of the Country which abounded with Forage, and then to renew the military Operations.
