dom to make an Advantage thereof; and that the greatest Part of the Gold Coin current here, is in the Two larger Pieces of Portugal Gold, one of which paffing for four Pounds, and the other for forty Shillings, great Inconveniencies and Difficulties daily arile in the obtaining Change for the fame; and that there being a Difproportion between the Value of the faid large Pieces, and the leffer Pieces of Foreign Gold Coin, to the Advantage of the larger, the fame has occafioned likewife a Scarcity of the leffer Pieces of Gold Coin, by Means whereof, great Diftrefs has been brought upon the Trade, and particularly the Linnen Manufacture of this Kingdom; and also upon his Majesty's Forces here: And therefore humbly prayed, that the Gold Coin, both English and Foreign current here, might be rated at the Quantity of English Silver they usually pass for in England, with an Allowance of some small Advantage to the leffer Pieces.

And whereas the Lords Commissioners of his Majetty's Treasury (to whom his Majesty thought proper to refer the Confideration of the faid Reprefentation) have reported to his Majesty in Council, that they had taken the Opinion of the late Master-Worker, and the reft of the principal Officers of his Majefty's Mint thereupon, who proposed that a Reduction should be made in the Value of the Gold Coins current in this Kingdom, at least as low as they are in Great Britain; and that the Disproportion between the larger and leffer Pieces should be rectified; which faid Proposal being agreed to by the faid Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, and approved of by his Majefty in Council, his Majefty has been gracioufly pleafed, by his faid Order in Council, to order, that the following Pieces of Gold Coin current in this Kingdom, do pass in Payment within this Kingdom, at the Rates herein after respectively specified, and that a Proclamation should be illued to that Effect.

We therefore the Lords Juffices and Council, in Obedience to his Majefty's faid Order, do by this our Proclamation publifh and declare, that the feveral Pieces of Gold Coin herein after mentioned, fhall from and after the Tenth Day of September next, pafs and be accepted in all Receipts and Payments, as well to and from his Majefty as otherwife howfoever, as current Money within this Kingdom, at the feveral Rates herein after refpectively specified, and none other, that is to fay,

fay, The Guinea at one Pound two Shillings and nine Pence.

And all other Pieces of the fame Species in Proportion.

The Moydore, weighing fix Penny-weight Twenty two Grains, at one Pound nine Shillings and three Pence.

The Half Moydore, weighing three Pennyweight eleven Grains, at fourteen Shillings and eight Pence.

The Quarter Moydore, weighing one Penny-weight feventeen Grains and an Half, at feven Shillings and four Pence.

The Quadruple Piftole of Gold, or Doubloon, weighing feventeen Penny-weight eight Grains, at three Pounds thirteen Shillings.

The Spanish or French Double Pistole of Gold, or the Doubloon or Double Louis d'Or, weighing eight Penny-weight fixteen Grains, at one Pound fixteen Shillings and fix Pence.

The Spanifr or French Piftole of Gold, weighing four Penny-weight eight Grains, at eighteen Shillings and three Pence.

The Spanish or French half Pistole of Gold, weighing two Penny-weight four Grains, at nine Shillings and two Pence.

The Spanish or French Quarter Pistole of Gold, weighing one Penny-weight two Grains, at four Shillings and seven Pence.

The French Louis d'Or of the new Species, weighing five Penny-weight five Grains, at one Pound two Shillings.

The French Half Louis d'Or of the new Species, proportionably, weighing two Penny-weight fourteen Grains and an Half, at eleven Shillings.

The French Quarter Louis d'Or of the new Species, proportionably, weighing one Penny-weight feven Grains and a Quarter, at five Shillings and fix Pence.

The Piece of new Gold Coin of Portugal, weighing eighteen Penny-weight ten Grains and an Half, at three Pounds leventeen Shillings and eight Pence.

lings and eight Pence. The Piece of new Gold Coin of Portugal, weighing nine Penny-weight five Grains and a Quarter, at one Pound eighteen Shillings and ten Pence.

The Piece of new Gold Coin of Portugal, weighing four Penny-weight fourteen Grains and an Half, at nineteen Shillings and fix Pence.

The Piece of new Gold Coin of Portugal, weighing two Penny-weight feven Grains and a Quarter, at nine Shillings and ten Pence.

The Piece of new Gold Coin of Portugal, weighing one Penny-weight three Grains and an Half, at four Shillings and eleven Pence.

And in Cafe any of the aforefaid Pieces of Foreign Gold fhall want of the refpective Weights herein before mentioned, then Allowance is to be given of two Pence for each Grain, one Penny for Half a Grain, and one Half-penny for one Quarter of a Grain fo wanting in any Piece of the faid Foreign Gold Coins, and fo proportionably for every greater want of Weight in the faid Pieces; and in Cafe fuch Defect of Weight as aforefaid, fhall be fupplied in Manner aforefaid, then and in fuch Cafe, every Piece fo defective in the Weight as aforefaid, and that Defect of Weight fo fupplied as aforefaid, is to be henceforth allowed, and to pafs as current Money as aforefaid.

And
