**L**etters from Petersbourg of the 3d Instant import, that the freshest Advices they had from Felt Marthal Count Munich, were, that he lay incamped on this Side of the River Bog, where the Country affords him Store of Provisions and Forage, and that he was watchful of the Motions of the Body of Turkish Forces commanded by the Seraskier of Bender: Some Advices say, the new Grand Vizier had taken upon him the Command of those Forces about Bender. We have Accounts from Vienna of the 11th Instant, that the Siege of Widdin was entirely laid aside for this Campaign, and that it was expected Count Seckendorff would soon begin his March for Bosnia, to execute Orders sent to him from the Imperial Court.
