They import, that in the first Conferences held there, the Turkish Plenipotentiaries appeared so fincerely disposed to forward the Negociations for Peace, that it was reckoned they might be brought to a happy Conclusion before the End of this Year The Court has fent back this Express with new Instructions to the Imperial Plenipotentiaries.
