**O**UR Advices from Niemeroff are, that four Conferences had been held there without entring upon any very material Affair; but in those Conferences the Turks shewed such a Disposition to Peace, as gave Hopes a Treaty may be concluded before this Year expires.

Vienna, Sept. 11, N. S. An Express from Niemeroff has brought Letters with which this Court appears to be well pleased. They import, that in the first Conferences held there, the Turkish Plenipotentiaries appeared so sincerely disposed to forward the Negotiations for Peace, that it was reckoned they might be brought to a happy Conclusion before the End of this Year. The Court has sent back this Express with new Instructions to the Imperial Plenipotentiaries.
