THE Sheriffs of the City of London having waited on his Royal Highnefs the Prince of Wales from the Lord Mayor and Court of Aldermen upon the Birth of the Princefs, to know his Royal Highnefs's Pleafure when he would be attended with their Compliments upon that Occafion ; his Royal Highness was pleafed to acquaint them, that when the Princess of Wales was recovered, he would let them know when it would be proper. According-ly this Day being appointed by their Royal Highnefles the Prince and Princess of Wales, for the Lord Mayor and Court of Aldermen to attend them, they waited upon their Royal Highneffes at Carlton Houfe near Pall-Mall, and being introduced by Sir William Irby, Bart. Chamberlain to her Royal Highnels, Mr. Baron Thomson, the Recorder of the City, made their Compliments to His Royal Highness in the following Speech.

May it please your Royal Highness, THE Lord Mayor and Court of Aldermen of the City of London, having early paid their Duty to their Royal Sovereign, and to her Majesty, upon the Birth of the Princefs; if it had been convenient, they would then have humbly begg'd Leave to congratulate your Royal Highness upon so happy an Occasion.

They now, by your Royal Highness's Permithon, presume to express their Joyful Sentiments on fo fortunate an Event : Fortunate ! not only as it has given your Royal Highnefs this your first born Princes, but as it yields most probable Hopes of many more Descendents from fuch illustrious Parents, and a most agreeable Prospect to all his Majesty's Subjects, of the Continuance of those many Blelfings, which they have fo long enjoyed under the Influence and Protection of your Royal Houle.

Your Royal Highness having done the highest Honour to the City of London, by most graciously condescending to become a Member of that Body, and having on many Occasions given evident Marks of your Royal Highness's good Will towards them,

THE Lord Mayor and Court of Aldermen I humbly beg Leave to address them-felves to your Royal Highness with their most hearty Congratulations upon your fafe Delivery, on the Birth of the Frinces, and the Reeftablishment of your Health. Your Royal Issue, Madam, will ever be dear to thele his Majesty's most faithful Subjects. They now entertain the plealing Hopes, that many amiable Qualities, Graces and Virtues, derived to the Princels from your Royal Highness, will make her in due Time an Ornament to a Throne, and a Bleffing to the World. They prefume to add their most ar-dent Withes, that your Royal Highness may prove the glorious Inftrument of Providence, by yielding a numerous Progeny, to be the Supporters of the Protestant Religion and British Liberty:

And that your Royal Highness may always find in Life, true Joy, lasting Comfort, and folid Happiness.

To which his Royal Highness made this most gracious Answer.

My Lord and Gentlemen,

I return you my Thanks and those of the Princess, for the Share you take in this Increase of the King's Family; and assure you, that whatever Children God may bless me with, I will infuse into them Sentiments agreeable to the Laws and Liberties of that Country they have the Happiness to be born in.

The City has always shewn such Zeal for the King and His Family, that I think it highly incumbent upon me to affure you, that I will be in all Times an hearty Well Wisher for your Trade and Prosperity.

Vienna, Sept. 14, N. S. This Court has at Three of the Clock in the Afternoon, for chufing Di-received a Courier trom Niemeroff, with Let. refors for the Year enfuing, and for the Diffatch of ters of the 26th past, N.S., by which they are informed, that the Ruffian Plenipotentiaries had delivered to the Turks, what was called their *Utimatum*, on the 24th; which conlifts, as is faid, in Demands of the formal Cettion of Afoph and Oczakow, and to have, inflead of the Crimea, the Illand of Taman, befides fome Diftricts of Lands in the Neighbourhood of the Borifthenes: That none of the two Parties shall for the future navigate upon the Black Sea with armed Ships; and that if the Tartars should attempt to make new Incursions for the future upon the Russian Territories, the Czarina may have it in her Power to chaftife them as the shall think proper, without being taxed to have broken the Peace between her and the Ottoman Porte. It is assured that the Demands of the Imperial Plenipotentiaries confift only upon uti Peffidetis at the Time of the Sign-ing; to which it is faid that the Turks thew'd no great Reluctancy: But as to the Demands of the Muscovites, they found themselves obliged to fend a Courier to Conftantinople for new Orders; for which Purpose they defired Pallports, as well from the Imperial, as from the Ruffian Plenipotentiaries, which were granted them. Count Seckendorff is supposed to be on his March towards Zwornick in Bofnia, as is likewife Prince Hildburgshausen : Count Kevenhuller remains with about 12000 Men at Precova, or in that Neighbourhood, in order to cover Niffa, and preferve the Communieation with the Danube; and Count Wallis, is to be reinforced with 3 or 4000 Men, and t) semain in Wallachia and Moldavia, Count Krniglegg Erps, who was formerly at the Hague, fet out the 12th Inftant for Nancy, in order with Baron Reifchack (who is to follow him in a few Days) to regulate the Limits of Lorrain and Alface; Count Coloredo and Baron Palm having declined to be charged with that Committion.
