HE Russian Armies are at present in Winter Quarters, and Felt Marshal Munich set out from Perevolotzna the 29th of last Month, in order to

the 29th of last Month, in order to go to Pultava, to view and put the Lines in the Ukraine in such a good Condition, that they may be desended from the Incursions of the Tartars during the Winter.

Vienna, Nov. 2, N. S. The last Letters from Niemerow, which were of the 17th past, have brought an Account of the Turkish Plenipotentiaries having declared there, that the Porte, not thinking the Propositions made by the Emperor and the Czarina of a Nature to be accepted, they looked upon Nature to be accepted, they looked upon the Congress as broke up, and would quit that Place on the 20th past, in order to re-turn to Constantinople; whereupon the Em-peror's Plenipotentiaries had immediately sent away a Courier to inform this Court, that they would likewise depart from Niemerow, and retire to Lemberg, to wait there for fur-ther Orders from hence. Count Kevenhuller being in a very bad State of Health, has de-fired and obtained Leave to come hither, and is expected very shortly. Count Seckendors being arrived here from the Army, has been forbidden to go out of his House: He received Yesterday from the Council of War, several Points of Accusations in Writing, to which he has already given an An-fwer this Morning. The Great Duke's Defwer this Morning. The Great Duke's De-parture for Tuscany is fixed for the 18th of January next, and his Dutchess designs to accompany him thither.

Hague, Nov. 15, N. S. Advices are come hither from Vienna, that the Town of Nissa furrendred to the Turks on the 22d of October, without making any Defence, for Want, 'twas faid, of Provisions and Ammunition; having obtained the fame Capitulation as the Turks when they delivered up that Place to the Imperialifts. That Count Seckendorff was confined to his House at Vienna, and likewise General Schmettau put under Arrest at

Breslaw, whither he was gone. Letters from Caminieck relate, that the Congress at Niemerow was dissolved, the Turkish Plenipotentiaries having retired from that Place on the 20th of October, and the Imperialists and Muscovites the 22d.
