the fame beilig afterwaids' countermanded, new Orders were issued the 24th, for all Peers and Peereffes to appear in Mourning on Sunday the 4th of December ; The Ladies to wear black Bombafines, plain Cambrick Linnen, Crape Hoods, Shamoy Shoes and Gloves, and Crape Fans; and for their Undress dark Norwich Crape. The Men to wear black Cloth, without Buttons on the Sleeves or Pockets, plain Cambrick Cravats and Weepers, Shamoy Shoes and Gloves, Crápe Hatbands, and black Swords and Buckles.

Petersbourg, Oct. 29. This Court has received Letters from Niemerow, dated the 9th Instant, by which they are informed, that all the Plenipotentiaries at the Congress had alieady quitted that Place, except Baron Tahlman, who was to fet out the next Day. The Turkith Ministers are returning home; the Imperial are to flay at Lemberg, and the Ruffian at Kioff, till they receive Orders from their respective Courts. The Seraskier who was taken Prifoner at Oczakow, arrived here the 23d Inftant with a great Retinue, and is very honourably entertained at the Czarina's. Expence: As he is looked upon here as a Man of great Confequence, it is not improbable but this Court may make use of him to begin a new Negociation for a Peace.

Drefden, Nov. 20, N. S. The Saxon Troops in Servia began their March the 5th Instant to go into their Winter Quarters. Count Rutowsky has received Orders to go with those Troops, and dispose them in their Winter Quarters, after which he has obtained Leave to return hither; and the King, who is very well fatisfied with the Conduct of that General, is faid to have refuled to enter into any Negociation for furnithing Troops for the next Campaign till he arrives here, who will be beft able to give an Account of the prefent Condition of those Troops that remain there, and what Terms will be most proper to infift upon from the Emperor for a further Number. Their Polifh Majefties and the Royal Family are returned from Huberts-berg to pass the Winter here. Copenhagen, Nov. 23, N. S. M. Schu-lembourg is arrived here from Paris, as

is M. Linftow from the Baillage of Cold-ing: The former has left his Family in France, being to return thither, as it is faid, very foon; the latter is conftituted Master of the Court to the Princels Charlotte. The Post of Master of the Horse to his Danish Majesty, vacant by the Removal of M. Vonder Luke to the Baillage of Roschild, is given to Colonel Kalckreuter, who quits the Command of a Regiment of Cuirafliers, which is probably intended for the Prince of Wirtemberg-Oels.

Whitehall, November 26. His Majesty has been pleased to appoint George Jackson, Elq; to be his Majesty's Consul at Genoa, in the Room of John Bagshaw, Esq; deceased.
