**T**HERE are as yet no Commissaries named to examine into the Conduct of Count Seckendorff, but it is still assured, that there will be a Commission appointed, and it is said that Felt Marthal Harrach will be at the Head of it, though he seems very averse to charge himself with such a Commission. The Empress has been so much out of Order lately with a Cold, that the Celebration of her Imperial Majesty's Name Day, which was last Tuesday, has been put off till next Sunday; but this Morning her Majesty is said to be a good deal better.

*Brussels, Nov. 30, N. S.* On the 21st Instant their Highnesses the Princess Royal and the Prince of Orange arrived at the Abbey of Grimbergue. On the 24th their Highnesses came hither, on which Day and the following, Entertainments were made for them by several Persons of the chief Quality at this Court; but the Satisfaction their Highnesses had in the extraordinary Esteem and Respect shewn to them, was on a sudden changed into Consternation and Grief by the News Her Royal Highness received on the 28th Instant of the Queen's Illness and being in Danger: Her Royal Highness was so struck with it, that it was found proper immediately to let her Blood, which not succeeding in one Arm was happily effected in the other. That Night their Highnesses gave Orders to have all in Readiness by next Morning to return to Breda: This could not be done so speedily, but that the Prince had Time first to take leave of the Archduchess and some of the principal Persons of her Court; and their Highnesses having taken a slender Dinner at their own Hotel, set out time enough to reach Antwerp by Eight or Nine a-Clock in the Evening.
