Drifden, Dec. 8. The last Letters from Count Rutowski of the 25th paft, inform us, that he was arrived at Temeswaer with the Saxon Troops on the Way to their Winter Quarters.

Hague, Dec. 13, N. S. The States of Holland are now fitting. They have had under Confideration the Effimate of War for the next Year, communicated to them at their last Meeting; as also a Memorial of the Pruf-fian Minister, demanding, in his Master's Name, that one of his Conmissaries might be admitted to the Conferences at Antwerp, on account of his Interest upon the River Maele, a Pretention rejected fome Years ago. 'Count Uhlefeld has notified to the States in a Conference, the Arreft of Count Seckendorff, and told them the Emperor's Reasons for fo doing. We have an Account here from Poland, that Oczakow was actually belieged by the Turks the 16th of October, the Grand Vi-zier being there himfelf. The Prince's Royal and the Prince of Orange continue at Breda.
