LAST Sunday the Duke of Courland received a Courier with the agreeable News, that the Royal Commission that was assembled at Dantzick, to settle the Convention between the King of Poland and the Duke, was happily terminated to the mutual Satisfaction of both Parties. This being his Highness's Birth-day all the Foreign Ministers and Russian Nobility waited on the Duke this Morning, and made him their Compliments.

Drifday, Dec. 8. The last Letters from Count Rutowski of the 25th past, inform us, that he was arrived at Temeswaer with the Saxon Troops on the Way to their Winter Quarters.

Hague, Dec. 12, N. S. The States of Holland are now sitting. They have had under Consideration the Estimate of War for the next Year, communicated to them at their last Meeting; as also a Memorial of the Prussian Minister, demanding, in his Master's Name, that one of his Commissaries might be admitted to the Conferences at Antwerp, on account of his Interest upon the River Maese, a Pretension rejected some Years ago. Count Uhlfeld has notified to the States in a Conference, the Arrest of Count Seckendorff, and told them the Emperor's Reasons for so doing. We have an Account here from Poland, that Oczakow was actually besieged by the Turks the 16th of October, the Grand Vizier being there himself. The Princess Royal and the Prince of Orange continue at Breda.
