The Night before, between Twelveand One a-Clock, the Royal Body was re-moved in a Hearle from St. James's to thePrince's Chamber adjoining to the Houle of Lords; being attended by the Countelles of Bristol and Pomfret, Ladies of the Bed chamber to her late Majesty, in one Coach. Mis. Herbert Bed-chamber Woman, and Mrs. Purcell Dreffer to her Majefty, in another Coach. The Earl of Grantham Lord Chamberlain, the Earl of Pomfret Master of the Horfe, and Lord Robert Montagu Vice-Chamberlain, to her Majefty, in another Coach. Gentlemen Ufhers and Pages to her Majefty in another Coach. The Gentleinen Ufhers and Pages to her Majefty, with one Exempt of the Yeomen of the Guards, flaid with the Royal Body till the Funeral. The Ladies of the Bed-chamber, Maids of Honour, and Bed-chamber Women, came to the Prince's Chamber about Eleven a-Clock in the Morning, and ftaid there till the Proceffion. Whilft the Royal Body lay in the Prince's Chamber, it was guarded by twenty Gentlemen of the Band of. Penfioners with their Axes, who were ran-ged on each Side the Room near the Body, ten on the Right Side of it, with the Lieu-tenant of the Band at their Head; and ten on the Left Side of it, with the Standard Bearer at their Head.

The Procession began about Six a-Clock at Night from the Prince's Chamber, and palled through the Old Palace Yard to the Great North Door of Westminster Abbey, all Great North Door of Weltiminiter Abbey, all the Way being railed in, and floored, and covered at Top, with Boards; and lined throughout on the Floor, the Sides, and over Head, with black Bays.
