Hambourg, December 20, N. S.

YESTERDAY the Deputies of this City gave a Grand Entertainment to the Danish Commissioners appointed to settle the Differences subsisting between the Court of Denmark and this Republick on Account of the Frontiers. The Season is so bad, that they have not been able to inspect the Places in Dispute; but there is Reason to believe that every Thing will be soon adjusted to the mutual Satisfaction of both Parties.

Hague, Dec. 27, N. S. Count Uhlfeldt has by Order of his Court renewed his Instances for borrowing two Millions of Florins, upon certain Securities offered, and refused before. The said Minister notified to the States some Days ago, that the Emperor, in Compliance to the States, has ordered his Commissioners at Antwerp to take under Consideration the Grievances of the States before any other Matters; but by the Advices received from thence, the Commissioners insist to have the Tariff settled before all: It is therefore supposed they had not yet received such Orders.
