

Copenhagen, Jan. 25, N. S. The Council was held Yesterday at Fridericksberg, and the several Colleges received their Expeditions as usual; but the King of Denmark, being somewhat out of Order, did not quit his Apartment, and there was no Court.

Dresden, Jan. 29, N. S. M. Rumpf, the Dutch Minister, presented the 25th Instant to the King, a Letter of Congratulation from the States General, on the Marriage of the eldest Princess with Don Carlos. This Court being not satisfied with the Manner their Troops are kept in Winter Quarters in Hungary, insist upon better Conditions for the next Campaign.

Berlin, Feb. 1, N. S. His Prussian Majesty has been pleased to appoint M. Borck, lately his Envoy Extraordinary in England, to go in the same Quality to the Court of Vienna, in the Room of M. Brandt, who is recalled, and has obtained the Place of President of the Ecclesiastical Affairs. Baron Gotter, formerly his Prussian Majesty's Minister at Vienna, is appointed to reside in that Quality, at the Court of Dresden. On Saturday last M. Ellard, his Prussian Majesty's chief Physician, was sent for to Potsdam, where the Queen of Prussia was indisposed. Her Majesty's Indisposition was attended with no ill Consequences; it proved only to be a Cold, which had fallen upon her Breast, of which her Majesty is at present pretty well recovered; but Princess Ulrica, their Prussian Majesties fifth Daughter, lies very ill of a Fever.
