Copenhagen, February 11, N.S.

N the 3d Inftant the Council was held, and there was a full Court at Fridericksberg. The King of Denmark being pretty well recovered of his Indisposition, came as usual into the Circle; and his Majesty dined asterwards in publick. General Sculemberg, who defigned to have let out upon his Return to Paris be-fore the End of last Month, is not gone yet. The Regiment of Cuiraffiers, made vacant by the Promotion of Colonel Kalkreuter to the Post of Master of the Horse, is given to the Prince of Wirtemberg-Oels, who is now in Germany.

Hague, Feb. 18, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland continue their Affembly, not having yet fettled their Domeftick Affairs that relate to the Estimate of War for the current Year prefented to them by the Council of State, to which they have not yet given their Consent. We have an Account from the Court of Petersbourg, that the new Grand Vizier at Conftantinople has been deposed, and the Caimacan of that City put into his Room, and that the latter is not judged equal to that Employment. Great Preparations of all Sorts are making by the Ruffians during the Winter, in order to an early Campaign in the Spring, unlefs the Turks prevent it by fome Propositions of Peace that may be judged acceptable.

Whitehall, February 10, 1737-8. Whereas two anonymous Letters were fent to John Berington, Efq; in March 1736 7, threatning to burn bis Houfes, Barns and Stables, &c. if he did not lay certain Sums of Money in the Places therein described; and another Letter, dated January 9, 1737, was sens by the Post, directed to Mr. Beninson, at his House at Beenham near Kiff in Berkshire, forthwith, threat-ning, that every thing he had should be burned, in cafe he did not get William Barnatt out of Goal, who had been committed on Suspicion of being concerned in writing and sending the Letters above-mentioned. And whereas a Letter dated /pril 23, 1737, and direfied to the Rev. Mr. Deen, living at Woolhamton, Berks, was found in Kiff-Green on the 25th of the faid Month, threatning the Life of the faid Mr. Deen, in cafe he did not fend Forty Pounds to a Place therein described : His Majesty, for the better discovering the Perfors concerned in writing and fending the faid Let-ters, is pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except John Wingfield, now a Pri-foner in Reading Goal, who is suspected to have been concerned therein) who shall discover his Accomplice er Accomplices, fo as they or any of them may be apprebended and convicted thereof.
