Petersbourg, January 24.

THE 19th Instant being the Anniversary of her Czariſh Maſteſty's Acceſſion to the Throne, the Foreign Miniſters and Ruſſian Nobility were invited to dine at Court, where every body appeared in very magnificent Cloaths, and after Dinner, according to the Cuſtom of that Day; the Czarina gave each of the Foreign Miniſters a Glaſs of Wine with her own Hand. The Night ended with a Ball, and all the Houſes of the Town were finely illuminated. Yeſterday the Prince of Heſſe Hombourg was married to the Hoſpodarine of Walachia, Prince Cantemir's Mother-in-Law. There was a Ball in the Evening, at which were preſent the Czarina, the Princes, the Duke and Dutcheſs of Courland, a great Number of the Ruſſian Nobility, and the Foreign Miniſters.

Dreſden, Feb. 12. The King has given the Command of the Troops in Hungary to Count Rutowsky till farther Order. This Court is not yet come to an Agreement with that of Vienna for Troops for the next Campaign. Count Wratiſlaus, the Imperial Mi- niſter, arrived here ſome Days ago.

Hambourg, Feb. 18. N S. We hear from Copenhagen, that his Daniſh Maſteſty's intended Journey into Holſtein is laid aſide. Baron Kurtzock, his Imperial Maſteſty's Au- dlick Counſellor and Miniſter in the Circle of Lower Saxony, has accepted, with the Em- peror's Permiſſion and Approbation, the Order of St. Anne of Slefwick-Holſtein, which his moſt Serene Highneſs the Duke of Hol- ſtein has conferred on him.
