HE 19th Inftant being the Anni-veifary of her Czarilh Majefty's Accession to the Throne, the Foreign Ministers and Russian Nobility were invited to dine at Court, where every body appeared in very magnificent Cloaths, and after Dinner, according to the Cuftom of that Day; the Czarina gave each of the Foreign Ministers a Glass of Wine with her own Hand. The Night ended with a Ball, and all the Houles of the Town were finely illuminated. Yefterday the Prince of Heffe Hombourg was married to the Hofpodarine of Walachia, Prince Cantemir's Mother-in-Law. There was a Ball in the Evening, at which were present the Czarina, the Princes, the Duke and Dutchefs of Courland, a great Number of the Ruflian Nobility, and the Foreign Ministers.

Drefden, Feb. i2. The King has given the Command of the Troops in Hungary to Count Rutowsky till farther Order. This Court is not yet come to an Agreement with that of Vienna for Troops for the next Campaign. Count Wratiflaus, the Imperial Mipister, arrived here some Days ago.

Hambourg, Feb. 18. N S. We hear from Copenhagen, that his Danish Majesty's in-tended Journey into Holstein is laid aside. Baron Kurtzock, his Imperial Majesty's Aulick Counfellor and Minister in the Circle of Lower Saxony, has accepted, with the Emperor's Permillion and Approbation, the Or-der of St. Anne of Slefwick-Hollftein, which his most Serene Highness the Duke of Holftein has conferred on him.
