And his Lordship having killed the Sovereign's Hand, and thanked his Majefty for the great Honour done him, rofe up and faluting all the Companions feverally, who made their Congratulations, his Lordthip then withdrew.

The Chancellor then declared his Majefty's Pleasure for filling the other vacant Stall; and whereas the Statutes forbid the Name of any Perfon to be put in the Scrutiny unlefs he hath actually received the Honour of Knighthood, Garter was commanded to bring in the Earl of Waldegrave, who being intro-duced between Garter and the Black Rod, kneeled down before the Sovereign, and being Knighted with the Sword of State, retired; and the Scrutiny being collected by the Chancellor, and delivered to the Sovereign in the former Manner, the Chancellor by the Sovereign's Command declared the Earl of Waldegrave duly elected, who being introduced and invested with the like Ceremonies, withdrew.

Garter then called over the Names of the Knights Companions, and thereon the Proceffion was made back to the Apartment next to his Majesty's Closet in the Manner before described.
