Berlin, Feb. 22, N. S. By Letters from Manheim of the 13th Instant we have an Account, that the Elector Palatine had that Day given his Answer, to the Memorials presented to him on the 10th about Bergue and Juliers; by which Answer he declared that he accepted entirely the Mediation of the four Powers, viz. the Emperor, the King of Great Britain, the French King, and the States General of the United Netherlands. The King of Prussia came to Town on Thursday last. Yesterday his Majesty was present at the Marriage of M. Gromkow's Daughter with M. Haufen, a Captain in Lieutenant General Schwerin's Regiment; and this Morning his Prussian Majesty returned again to Potzdam.

Hague, Feb. 28, N. S. The King of Prussia has caused Complaints to be made by his Minister here, of the Violences lately committed by some of the States Subjects of Guelderland on his Majesty's Territories. Upon which 'tis not doubted their High Mightinesses will cause Satisfaction to be made, the Proceeding complained of being generally disapproved.

This Day Don Thomas Geraldino, the King of Spain's Minister Plenipotentiary, had a private Audience of the King at St. James's, to impart to his Majesty, in the Name of the King of the Two Sicilies, his Marriage with the Princess Royal of Poland Maria Amalja.

St. James's, February 24.

This Day Signior Pucci, charg'd with the Affairs of the Grand Duke of Tuscany, had a private Audience of his Royal Highness the Duke; to which he was introduc'd by Sir Clement Cottrell, Knight, Master of the Ceremonies.

He had afterwards a private Audience of their Royal Highnesses the Princesses, Amelia, Caroline, Mary, and Louisa; to which he was introduc'd by the Master of the Ceremonies.
