Berlin, Feb. 22, N. S. By Letters from Manheim of the 13th Inflant we have an Account, that the Elector Palatine had that Day given his Answer to the Memorials prefented to him on the 10th about Bergue and Juliers; by which Anfwer he declared that he accepted entirely the Mediation of the four Powers, viz. the Emperor, the King of Great Britain, the French King, and the States General of the United Netherlands. The King of Pruffia came to Town on Thurfday laft. Yefterday his Majefty was prefent at the Marriage of M. Gromkow's Daughter with M. Haufen, a Captain in Lieutenant General Schwerin's Regiment; and this Morning his Pruffian Majefty returned again to Potzdam.

The King of Prussia has caused Complaints to be made by his Minister here, of the Violences lately committed by some of the States Subjects of Guelderland on his Majesty's Territories. Upon which 'tis not doubted their High Mightinefles will caufe Satisfaction to be made, the Proceeding complained of being generally difapproved.
