**O**N the 14th Instant Felt Marshal Lacy set out from hence to go to his Estate in Livonia, where it is said he is to stay till the Middle of next Month, and then return to his Command in the Ukraine. Felt Marshal Munich left this Place the 25th of this Month, in order to go to Kioff, and prepare every Thing necessary for the next Campaign. Last Saturday being the Czarina's Birth-day, all the Foreign Ministers went in the Morning to make their Compliments to her Majesty, and dined at Court; where there was a Ball in the Evening, and at Night a Fire-work, and all the City was finely illuminated. The same Day the Czarina conferred the Honour of the Order of St. Andrew on the Prince of Bevern, who is a Major General, and declared him one of the Majors of the Simonofsky Regiment of Guards; and Prince Peter, the Duke of Courland's eldest Son, was made a Lieutenant Colonel of her Majesty's Life-Guard.

*Vienna, Feb. 19, N. S.* We have received here confirm'd Advices from the Frontiers of Turkey, of the Deposition of the Grand Visier, and of the Caimacan of Constantinople's having been put in his Place. Count Fuenclara, the Spanish Ambassadour, set out this Morning for Dresden, where he is to take the Character of Ambassadour, both from his Catholick Majesty, and from the King of the Two Sicilies.

*Dresden, Feb. 26, N. S.* The Count de Fuenclara is expected here To-morrow. The Marriage of Don Carlos with the Princess Royal is to be in the Month of May; and this Court are preparing to give a splendid Festival on that Occasion, which will last eight Days, as Balls, Illuminations, and a Carrousel, besides the Ambassadour's Publick Entry: He is to be lodged at the Court, and to be served by the King's Servants, and to be defrayed. This Court have as yet taken no Resolution with regard to their Troops in Hungary; and it is thought they wait for a final Answer from Vienna, to resolve what to do.
