N the 14th Inftant Felt Marshal Lacy fet out from hence to go to his Effate in Livonia, where it is faid he is to flay till the Middle of next Month, and then return to his Command in the Ukraine. Felt Marshal Munich left this Place the 25th of this Month, in order to go to Kioff, and prepare every Thing neceffary for the next Campaign. Laft Saturday being the Czarina's Birth-day, all the Foreign Ministers went in the Morning to make their Compliments to her Majesty, and dined at Court; where there was a Ball in the Evening, and at Night a Fire-work, and all the City was finely illuminated. The fame Day the Czarina conferred the Honour of the Order of St. Andrew on the Prince of Bevern, who is a Major General, and declared him one of the Majors of the Simonofsky Regiment of Guards; and Prince Peter, the Duke of Courland's eldeft Son, was made a Lieutenant Colonel of her Majefty's Life-Guard.

Vienna, Feb. 19, N. S. We have re-ceived here confirm'd Advices from the Frontiers of Turkey, of the Depolition of the Grand Visier, and of the Caimacan of Conftantinople's having been put in his Place. Count Fuenclara, the Spanish Ambassiadour, fet out this Morning for Dresden, where he is to take the Character of Ambassiadour, both from his Catholick Majesty, and from the King of the Two Sicilies.

Drefden, Feb. 26, N. S. The Count de Fuenclara is expected here To-morrow. The Marriage of Don Carlos with the Princefs Royal is to be in the Month of May; and this Court are preparing to give a fplen-did Feftival on that Occasion, which will laft eight Days, as Balls, Illuminations, and a Carroufel, befides the Ambaffador's Publick Entry: He is to be lodged at the Court, and to be ferved by the King's Servants, and to be defrayed. This Court have as yet taken no Resolution with regard to their Troops in Hungary; and it is thought they wait for a final Answer from Vienna, to refolve what to do.
