A PROCLAMATION,

For putting in Execution the late Ast againft retailing of Spirituous Liquors, and for protesting the Officers of Justice, and all others in their just and laudable Endeavours, to assist the Magistrates therein, and for suppressing all Combinations and Confederacies, to encourage Disobedience to the said Law; and for punishing all Attempts by Riots, or otherwise to insult and abuse those who give Informations, and make Discoveries of the Offenders against the said Ast; and for putting in Execution the Ast of Parliament made against Riots, in the First Tear of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the First.

Hereas in order to put a Stop to the pernicious Practice of com-mon and excellive drinking of Brandy, Geneva, and other Spirituous Liquors, fo destructive of the Health, Morals, and Industry of our Subjects, and for manifeftly injurious to the publick Peace and Tranquility, an Act of Parliament was made in the Ninth Year of our Reign, intitled, An Act for laying a Duty upon Retailing of Spi-rituous Liquors, and for licenting Retailers thereof; whereby all Perfons are prohibited to fell or retail the fame in left Quantity than Two Gallons, without Licence, in fuch Manner as is therein directed, and upon the Penalties thereby inflicted : And whereas by the Diligence of the proper Officers, and others of our good Subjects, on whole Informations alone the faid Act can be carried into Execution, and by the Punifhment of divers Offenders against the faid Law, the fame has, in a great Meafure, had its defired Effect : And whereas it has been represented to us, That divers wicked and ill-defigning Perfons, out of Regard to their own private Gain, though to the Destruction of their Fellow Subjects, in order to defeat the wife and good Ends of the faid Act, and to reftore and encourage the faid Practice of common and excellive

drinking Spirituous Liquors, have, of late, excited and encouraged divers Riots and Tumults on Occasion of the arresting and profecuting Offenders against the faid Act, and have formed Confpiracies and Combinations among themselves for the Encouragement of fuch Offenders, by large Contributions to luch of them, who have been profecuted and convicted; and that great Endeavours have been used by such and the like Practices, to encourage those and others in their Disobe+ dience to the faid Act : And whereas it has been reprefented to us, That divers diforderly, wicked, and malicious Perfons have lately, within our City of Westminster, and the Li-berties thereof, and in other Parts of our Realm, in a tumultuous and riotous Manner assembled themselves, at various Times, to refcue Offenders against the faid Law, and to infult and abufe those who have been comcerned in bringing them to Juffice; and have in a most wicked, cruet, and outragious Manner, in open Defiance of the Law, affaulted, beat, wounded, and almost murdered several Officers, and others of our good Subjects, who have, in Pursuance of the faid Act, given Informations before our Justices of the Peace against such Offenders : And whereas by the known Law of this our Realm, all Perfons who are contriving, aiding, affifting, abeta ting, promoting, or encouraging luch Riots, are guilty not only of luch Riots, and thereby liable to the fevere Punishments inflicted on fuch Crimes, but also are guilty of all the immediate Confequences thereof, in the beating, wounding, or killing any Perform, though they may not be performed by acting therein, and whether the Performs for beat, wounded, or murdered, be any of the Rioters themfelves, occafioned by their own Refiftance, or any others against whom fuch Richs are railed, and are liable equally with the immediate Actors; to the Punishment of Death, or otherwile, according to the Nature. of the Chime : And whereas by another Act of Parliament made in the First Year of our tate Royal Father's Reign; entituled, An Act for preventing Fumules, and riotous Atlene-blies, and for the more speedy and effectual punishing the Rioters ? it is enabled That if any
