Whitehall, April 3.

N Easter Sunday the King, the Duke, the three Princesses Amelia, Caroline, and Mary, with several Persons of Quality and Distinction, received the Holy Sacrament in the Royal Chapel at St. James's; the Communion Office being personned by the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of London, Dean of the Chapel.

Dublin Castle, March 28, 1738.

The 26th Instant his Grace the Duke of Devonshire, Lord Lieutenant of this Kingdom, embarked for England; upon which Occasion, the Foot Forces on Duty here lined the Streets, and his Grace was attended by the Dragoon Forces likewise on Duty, together with the Battle-Axe Guards and Officers of State, to the Water-side; to which Place his Grace was accompanied by a great Number of the Nobility, and other Persons of Distinction: And this Day his Grace the Lord Primate, the Lord Chancellor, and the Speaker of the House of Commons, were sworn in Gouncil as Lords Justices of this Kingdom.

Petersbourg, March 14. We have Letters from Conftantinople which relate, that the Grand Signior had declared his Refolution to yield up Asoph for ever to the Czarina, on Condition she will restore Oczakow, the Fortisications of which he proposes to demolish; and surther proposes to enter into an Agreement with the Czarina, that neither Party shall hereaster fortisy any Place upon the Black Sea. At the same Time these Letters add, that there was great caballing among the Janislaries at the Porte, who murmured against those Counsellors of the Divan whom they knew or suspected to be for making Peace.

Vienna, March 26, N.S. The reigning Empress has been ill these sour Days of a fore Throat and a Fever, but her Imperial Mariesty was better this Day at Noon. The Grand Dutchess of Tuscany has been carried publickly twice to Church in a Chair, being near four Months gone in her Pregnancy.

Brussels, April 9, N. S. The States of Brabant have now taken on them the Quota of the County of Namur, as well as their own, towards raising Four Millions of Florins for the Emperor's Service. But the small Province of Mecklin, instead of their Consent, have taken on themselves the raising their Quota in the said Sum. It is given out here, that the whole Regiment of Wurmbrand, which lies at Mons and at Aeth, is to march this Season for Hungary.
