## Petersbourg, March 25.

HIS Court continues to make great Preparations, in order to our Armies taking the Field early in the Spring. It is faid, that Felt Marshal Munich's Army, which is to confift of 94000 regular Troops, and 40000 Coffacks and Calmucks, will be affembled at Perevolotzna by the 15th of next Month, from whence they are to march towards Oczakow as foon as the Seafon of the Year will permit them to pafs the Defert. Felt Marthal Lacy is alfo pre-paring to affemble his Army, which is to confact of 40000 regular Troops, 10000 Calmucks, 6000 Don Coflacks, and 7000 Tartars, with which he is to return to the Crimea, fome fay to befiege Jenicala, a little 'Town near Kertz; others are of Opinion he will endeavour to demolifh entirely the Wall and Forts of the Perecop, and lay Wafte all the Country. Prince Chercaskoy, one of the Cabinet Ministers, having obtained Leave of the Czarina to go to Moscow for fix Months, fet out for that Place last Thursday. General Leontoff, who formerly commanded the Ruffian Troops in Perfia, is made Governor of Aloph; and Lieutenant General Douglass is made Governour of Revel; and General Romanfoff succeeds the late Prince Barratenskoy as General Director of the Ukraine.

Vienna, April 12, N.S. It is confirmed that the Garrifon of Ulitza capitulated on the 24th past, after a very stout and vigorous Defence, the heavy Cannon which the Turks had brought thither from Zwornick, having ruined most Part of the Tower which was the chief Defence of the Place, and difmounted the two only Pieces of Artillery which the Belieged had. We have thele further Circumstances ; when Captain Lersner, the commanding Officer, demanded first to capitulate, the Turkish General at the Siege faid

for he and all the Garrison must perish by the Sword ; upon which the Imperial Garrifori fent him Word, that if they must perish, they had Powder enough to make three Times as many Turks perifh as there were Germans in the Place; and that when they should be reduced to the two last Barrels, they would make use of them to blow up themselves and what remained of the Tower in the Air, rather than fall into fuch barbarous Hands: But the Turks feeing their generous Refo-lution, granted at laft the Capitulation. It is affured that eight common Soldiers of the Regiment of Marulli, all Neapolitans, refufed to follow the Garrison, and took Party amongst the Turks; most of them had their Wives, who flayed with them likewife. This Court has received a Courier from Prince Lobko-witz in Tranfylvania, with Advice, that Ra-gotski is arrived at Choczim upon the Frontiers of Poland, from whence a great many Copies of his Manifesto had been spread in Tranfylvania, where it had already caufed a good deal of Ferment among the Natives, and even to fuch a Degree, that Prince Lobkowitz had been obliged to feize in the Night and imprifon feveral of them, amongft whom are 15 Perfons of Note. This Advice has, with the greatest Reason, made this Court look upon that Affair of Ragotski to be of fuch Importance, that it has been already refolved to have a Body of 20000 Men in those Parts.

## Whitehall, April 21, 1738.

Whereas it has been represented to His Majefy, That on the Fourteenth Day of this Instant April, in the Evening, a great Number of People assembled them-felves in the City of Bristol, in a viotous and tumultuous Manner; that the Mazistrates of the faid City having caused the Proclamation for preventing Tumults to be read, they dispersed at that Time, but assembled again the next Morning in the fame tiotous Manner : And whereas an anonymous Leiter was, on the 18th late, the Turkish General at the Siege faid Instant, taken up in the Court of the Dwelling-House that he would grant no Capitulation at all, of Nathaniel Day, Esq, Mayor of that City, threatning hund
