Vienna, May 3, N. S.

COUNT Philip Kinski is made Great Chancellor of Bohemia, in the Room of the late Count Colowrath. The Great Duke of Tuscany is to set out next Monday on a Pilgrimage to Marien-Zelle in Stiria, from whence his Royal Highness is expected back the Thursday following.

Vienna, May 7, N. S. We have Advice here, that the Turks have thrown Fourteen thousand Men into an Island which lies in the Danube between Orfova and Widdin, wherein they have erected two strong Batteries of Cannon, in order to hinder all Manner of Navigation upon that River from Orfova. The Great Duke of Tuscany has declared his Intention to set out by Water for the Army on the 18th Instant, having laid aside his going to Marien-Zelle, on account of the great Snows which are still upon the Mountains of Stiria. Count Koniglegg designs to follow his Royal Highness on the 22d Instant by Land; so that they may both arrive about the same Time at Belgrade.

Berlin, May 13, N. S. The five Regiments of Foot, which come hither every Year, to pass in Review before his Prussian Majesty, have Orders to be in Town on Thursday the 22d Instant; and 'tis said the general Review of them, and of the Regiments of this Garrison, is fix'd for the 27th. His Prussian Majesty's Journey to Cleves is also fix'd for the 4th of July next.

Hague, May 20, N. S. The States of Holland separated on Saturday last, to meet again on the 4th of next Month. They pass'd a Resolution to oblige the Roman Catholicks of this Country to pay for the future, every 30 Years, a certain Fine for all the Estates belonging to the Roman Church; a thing not practis'd before, and very disagreeable to the Roman Catholicks, who hitherto, upon several Pretences, had avoided being subject to it. The Prince of Orange and the Princess Royal are expected to Day at Breda.
