Petersbourg, April 22.

Marshal Munich has left his Winter Quarters at Pultawa, and is gone to join his Troops that are assembling at Perevolotzna, where a Bridge of Boats is already built for the Army to pass the Nieper, in order to march towards O. zakow. The little Vessels and Boats commanded by Vice Admiral Sinawin, are all laden with Provisions and Ammunition for the Troops, and are gone from Brensky down the River Nieper. It is said there that Ombo, with all his Calmucks (except those who are to serve this Campaign under the Felt Marshals Munich and Lacy) is already marched to invade the Territories of the Cuban Tartars; where probably he may meet with a stout Resistance, for a great Number of the Inhabitants of the Crimea and neighbouring Tartars are retired into that Country for Want of Provisions at Home. M. Maurian, the Swedish Secretary, who has been here a great many Years, is recalled. The King of Poland has sent M. Traidon, the Dutches of Courland's Brother, who is in his Service, with two blue Ribbons of the Order of the White Eagle for the Duke of Courland's two Sons. Vienna, May 10, N. S. It is confirmed that the Turks have taken Possession and that

Vienna, May 10, N. S. It is confirmed that the Turks have taken Possession of an Island between Orsova and Widdin, and that they are hard at Work to fortify it. There has been a little Action between the Turks and the Garrison of Orsova, near that Place; the Turks, who were repulsed twice, are said to have lost; or 400 Men. The Plague begins to extend itself in the Bannat of Te meswaer, wherein several Villages have been insected lately. This News gives the greater Uneasiness here, because it is very difficult to take the necessary Measures to hinder the Communication of that terrible Distemper in the present Circumstances, when, besides the Motions of the Troops, there is so much Need of a frequent Intercourse with that Province. The Grand Duke set out Yesterday Morning for Marien-Zelle, and is expected

back at Laxemberg the 12th at Night, in order to celebrate his Confort's Birth-day on the 13th.

Dresden, May 18, N. S. The Queen Consort of Don Carlos set out from hence the 12th Instant for Pilnitz, attended by the Nobility in great Magnissicence and Ceremony, where was represented an Italian Comedy, and there was afterwards a great Supper, and Firework. The 13th the Queen continued her Journey, and their Polish Majessies returned hither. Count Collobrath, Brotherin-Law to the Count de Bruhl, is gone with the Queen as Chamberlain, and it is said that he will remain at Naples as Minister from this Court, or else continue his Journey to Madrid to be Minister there. The King gave M. Fuenclara at parting his Picture set in Diamonds, which is valued at 40000 German Florins. Count Western, Chamberlain, is sent to Petersbourg with the News of the Marriage. The King goes to Fraustadt the 27th or 28th of this Month, to sign the Universalia for holding the Diet in September at Warsaw: His Majesty will not be absent above five or six Days, so that none of the Foreign Ministers will follow him.
