Vienna, June 11, N. S.

ON Sunday the 8th Instant, the Mar-ques de Bota, a General in the Imperial Service, arriv'd from Belgrade with a new Plan of Operations, as 'cis said, conformable to the present State of Affairs in those Parts. He confirms the Surrender of Meadia, where the Turks having made a Breach in a Fort defended by a Captain and 80 Men, they desired to capitulate; which the Turks refus'd, unless Count Piccolomini, who was with the rest of the Garrison in an opposite Fort, surrendred likewise; and the latter thought proper to do so for Want of Powder; whereupon his Garri-son was accordingly permitted to retire to New Orlova, the Turks having taken Nothing from them but three or four Colours which they had lost in the preceeding At-tacks. The Surrender of this Place is of great Consequence, for though the Imperial Army should in Time be able to retake it, the Turks may, in the mean while, have Leisure enough to ruin a great Part of the Bannat of Temeswar, particularly certain Mines which are not far distant from Meadia.
