AT the Court at *Kensington*, the Thirty-first Day of *July*, 1738.

P R E S E N T,

The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint his Grace Charles Duke of Marlborough to be Lord Lieutenant of the Counties of Buckingham and Oxford, his Grace this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

*Petersbourg*, July 4. On the 2d Instant a Courier arrived here from Felt Marshal Munich, with Letters dated the 17th of June, at which Time he was advanced within 20 or 30 Versts of the River Bog, where he waited till the Division of the Army that is commanded by General Romanoff should join him, which he expected every Day; so that he designed to pass the Bog the 22d. It was reported that 40000 Turks had passed the River Dniester to meet the Russians; but that about 20000 Budziack Tartars, who were near Bender, refused to follow them. The 29th of last Month being the Anniversary of St. Peter and Paul, the Czarina and the Knights of St. Andrew went to Church in the Morning with the Habit and Collar of the Order; and all the Knights had the Honour to dine with her Majesty. The Foreign Ministers were invited to come to Court in the Afternoon, where there was a Ball. On the 1st Instant Count Werthern had his Audience of Leave of her Czarish Majesty, who was pleased to give him a Diamond Ring valued at about 2000 Rubles, and he set out Yesterday in order to return to Dresden.

*Naples*, July 8, N. S. On the 2d Instant the King and Queen of the two Sicilies made their publick Entry into this City, with the greatest Pomp and Splendor; and with all Demonstrations of publick Joy. On this Occasion the King created 46 Knights of St. Januarius, a new Order of his own instituting; and has sent Crosses of that Order to his Royal Brothers in Spain.

HIS Majesty's Plate of One hundred Guineas, will be run for on Monday the 4th of September next, on the round Course on the South Side of Lincoln, by any Horse, Mare or Gelding, being no more than six Years old the last Grass, carrying 12 Stone, three Heats, to be shewn and enter'd at the Nagg's Head in Waddington, on Saturday the 2d in the Evening before they run.
