Petersbourg, July 13.

N the 11th Instant the Czarina with all her Court fet out for Petershoff. On the 13th a Courier arrived here from Felt Marshal Lacy, with Letters dated the 30th of June, importing, that three Days before he arrived with his Army about 40 Versts from Perecop, where he found the Gniloie More fo dry, that he palled the fame with the greatest Part of his Army and Artillery, leaving the Remainder on the other Side, with all the Tents standing, that the Enemy might not perceive his Defign; which fucceeded fo well, that he got into the Crimea without much Trouble, and took a little Fort the Tartars had raifed near the Place he paffed. Next Day he advanced to the Perecop, where the Ruffians railed two Batteries; and after firing and flinging Bombs into the Town and Caftle of Or for 36 Hours, the Bashaw with his Garrison confisting of 2000 Janiflaries and about 100 Tartars, furrendred the Place the 29th of June, and were made Priloners of War. Just as the Turks were capitulating, the Tartar Cham ap-proached with about 40000 Turks and Tartars, as if he defigned to attack the Ruffians, but as foon as Felt Marshal Lacy with his Dragoons advanced to meet them, they retired with Precipitation, and the Bashaw immediately delivered up the Town and Caftle to Colonel Lacy, the Felt Marshal's Son, whom he had sent to take Possession of it with 10 Companies of Grenadiers. Eighty Brass Cannon and Mortars were found in the Town. This great News was made known to the People of Petersbourg, Croonstadt, and Petershoff, by the firing of all the great Guns that are in those Places, as well as those of the fix Ruf-fian Men of War commanded by Rear Admiral O Brian, that are cruizing in the Gulf of Finland in order to exercise the Seamen. Last Night a Courier arrived at Petershoff with Letters from Felt Marshal Munich, importing, that having passed the Bog, and the Kodina near its Fall into the Bog, he had encamped between those two Rivers: That on the 29th

of laft Month, a vaft Number of Tartars and Spahis appeared, who the next Day attacked his Troops on all Sides; but after an Action which lafted five Hours he put them all to Flight. As the Felt Marshal's Letter was writ immediately after the Action, he could not tell how many Turks and Tartars were killed, but supposed there must have been a great Number. The Loss of the Russians was inconfiderable.

From the Imperial Camp at Lugos, July 25. Arriving at Caranfebes the 20th Inflant, we remained there the 21fl and 22d, to give the Cavalry and the whole Army fome Reft, which they had not had for fome Time. On the 23d we marched to Cfena, where in the Evening arrived an Officer of Hullars, with the News that 15000 Turks had returned to renew the Siege of Meadia; and it being im-poffible that Place fhould hold out, unless a ftrong Body of Troops could be at hand to fupport it, Orders had been left with the Governour Colonel Berenclau, in cafe the Turks should return, to capitulate, which he accordingly did, making the fame Capitulation, and marching out with the fame Honours as were granted to the Enemy when we took it. A Captain of Ingeniers, who was to have brought that Capitulation to Felt Marshal Count Koniglegg, and was accompanied by a Turk who was charged with a Letter to the faid Felt Marshal, hat the Misfortune to be killed on the Way by Rob-bers. On the 24th we marched to Lugosfell, from whence an Anfwer was returned to the Letter which the faid Turk had brought from the Bashaw of Widdin, who commands their Army; and a Guard was fent with the Meffenger to conduct him to their Camp, which is now faid to be between Meadia and Caranfebes, where they will have difficulty enough to fublif for want of Provisions and Forage. Two French Couriers have paffed here on their Way from Conftantinople to Vienna; they came hither with the forementioned Turk, and with the fame Efcorte that conducted him to our Camp. Since our coming hither, the Body of Troops which were
