in great Confusion, leaving, contrary to their usual Custom, a great Number of their Dead in the Field of Battle. The 9th our Army continued their March directly towards the Dniester.

Vienna, Aug. 9, N.S. The last Letters from the Imperial Army of the 2d Inftant, are dated from Schebel, two German Miles to the South of Temeswaer, where they have good Forage, and are well supplied with Provi-fions. They had no certain Intelligence of the Defigns of the Turks, but it was apprehended they would either come into the Bannat and endeavour to engige the Imperialists in a general Action, or fit down before Belgrade, or march into Transylvania, the lat-ter of which was thought the most probable; and it was reported, that an advanced Body of the Turks was at Caranfebes, which Poft, if kept, cuts off the great Communication with Tranfylvania by the Porta Ferrea. The Turks have turned their Siege of Orfova in-to a Blockade. The Duke of Tufcany being still indifposed, was blooded Yesterday.
