### Petersbourg, August 8.

AST Saturday Night Felt Marshal Munich's Adjutant General arrived at Peterhoff with Letters dated the a4th of July, by which his Excellency informs her Majesty, that the Turkish Army was on the other Side of the River Dniester, fo that they did not seem willing to hazard a Battle, at least on this Side the River, as he expected they would. The Day before the Courier set out, above 15000 Tartars and Turkish Horse had attacked the Felt Marshal's Advance Guard, but were repulsed with great Loss.

From the Camp of the Imperialists at Se-mendria, Aug. 22. Last Night, to the great Surprize of the Army, an Officer arrived from Orfova with an Account of the Garrifon having on the 16th capitulated with the Turks to furrender the Town on the 17th. The Turks had 150 Cannon mounted, with which they kept a continual Fire till the 13th, when they fummon'd the Town to furrender without having made a Breach of any Confequence; but the Garrifon being reduced to 500 (the Detachment of 200 from Belgrade which got into Orfova the roth, being included in that Number) they yielded ; and marched out on the 17th, and were efcorted to Vipalanka : 1300 Men of the Garrifon had died of the Scurvy fince the 15th of July; and there is Reason to believe the Plague alfo was rife in the Place.

Vienna, Aug. 30, N.S. Yesterday Morning came Advice of the Surrender of Orfova to the Turks. The Grand Duke of Tuscany is not yet set out from hence for the Army.
