Rome, Scpt. 20, N.S. The King of Naples has ordered the Building of a Ship of War of 40 Guns, and 'twas faid that four Gallies will alfo be built for the Squadron of Sicily. The Hereditary Grandees of Spain at Naples, who were not allowed to cover before the King, becaufe they had never been at the Court of Spain, have obtained that Privilege by Leave of his Catholick Majefly, and accordingly they have begun to enjoy it at the Court of Naples; on which Occafion the Duke de Giovenazzo, the Prince di Bafignano, and the Marquefles del Vafto, di Caniglia, and di Teraci, kifled the King's

Hand. The Pope, on the Rumour that the Duke of Modena defigus to make an Attempt on Ferrara, has ordered thither a Reinforcement of Soldiers. The Grand Duke of Tufcany has asked Leave of the Pope to raife a Contribution on the Ecclefiafticks in his Dominions; to which Requeft the Pope has not yet confented, 'tis faid, on Account of the Dependency of the two Fiefs of Scavolina and Carpegna, which is yet unfettled. Count Rovera is daily expected here as Minifter Extraordinary from the King of Sardinia, to confirm the Reconciliation between this Court and that of Turin.

Leghorn, Sept. 24. By Order from the Council of Regency, feveral Military Officers of this Garrifon have been difmifs'd: To fome few of them, in Confideration of their Services, a fmall Penfion has been allowed, on Condition that they fhall not go out of Tufcany. The Commanders of all the Towers and finall Forts along the Sea Coafts are alfo difcharged; inflead of whom Serjeants from the neighbouring Garrifons are order'd to take Charge of the faid Forts. &c.

In Confequence of the Conferences held by M. de Braitewiz at the Council of War, about 80 Tufcan Officers have been difniffed from the refpective Fortreffes, Garrifons, and Places of Tufcany. On the 19th, M. de Wachtendonck arrived here from Leghorn, in order to forward the military Plan for the new regulating and forming of a Tufcan Regiment, which is to be compofed of 17 Companies of 120 Men each, on the German Footing; as well as to confult with the Receiver General of the Grand Duke's Revenues the Manner for fupplying regularly the Appointments to the Imperial Troops in Tufcany, to be reimburfed, it is faid, to the Grand Duke at Vienna, out of the Emperor's Treafury. On the 20th, M. de Wachtendonck had an Audience of the Electorefs Dowager Palatine, and on the 25th, attended by two Imperial Officers, whom he brought with him from Leghorn, fet out from hence to infpect the Fortreffes and Paffages on the Mugello and the Bologna Road. On the 15th the Duke of Modena fet out from Saffuolo for Maffa, by the way of Seravezza.

8 or 9 Inches high, of a fairith freth Complexion, about 25 Years of Age, who kept the Coach and Horfes Inn in the C ty of Coventry about two Years ago, fince lodged in Cold Bath Fields, London, afterwards at one Wills ims, a Chandler on Saffron Hill, afterwards moved and kept a Houfe in the Market-place, Hoxton, from thence mowed to the Broad Santtuary, Westminster, from thence to the Mulberry Garden in St. George's Fields, South wark, from thence to Wood's Close near Clerkenwell; bis last Habitation was near the Three Hats, Islington.

Joseph Benson, about 5 Foot 6 Inches high, between 60 and 70 Years old, stoops a little, wears a Wig, and his Hair pretty long under it, and is a thin Spare Man, born near Naresborough in Yorkshire, by Trade a Gunfinith, noted for making Cross Bows, formerly lived in Dublin; his last Place of Habit stion was as Cats-Hole in St. Catherine's, near the Tower. N. B. Joseph Benfon is the Maker of the Engine lately found in the New River, and bas made several Engines for m lling the Guineas, and is reckoned by the Guhfm ths an ingenious Man at his Business.
