The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This Day the Right Hon. John Verney, Esq; Master of the Rolls, was by his Majesty's Command sworn of his Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, that the Parliament which stands prorogued to Friday the Thirteenth of this Instant October, should be further prorogued to Thursday the Seventh Day of December next.

Vienna, Oct. 8, N. S. Letters from Belgrade of the 1st Instant relate, that Count Konigseg having Advice that about 15000 Turks had appeared near Meadia, and that another Party had entred the Bannat by Vialanka, he passed the Danube on the 27th of last Month with the Imperial Cavalry, and marched as far as Panchova; but having Intelligence there that the Enemy had retired, he repassed the Danube and the Save on the 28th, and returned to the Camp at Semlin. Felt Marshal Wallis is very ill of a Fever at Belgrade, and there are no less than 400 Officers, of one Rank or other, sick at the Army, or absent from it on Account of Sickness. The repairing and augmenting the Fortifications of Belgrade, were carried on with the greatest Diligence; for since the 18th of September to the 1st Instant, 1500 Men at a time had been constantly at Work. Other Letters from Belgrade of the 4th Instant advise, that Colonel Count Cornberg the late Governour of Orsova, dying at Belgrade, was interr'd there that Day, with the usual military Honours. The Prince of Hildesburghausen was ordered to go and receive the auxiliary Saxon and Bavarian Troops at Reterwaradin. These Letters add, that Count Konigsegg designed to pass the Danube again, in order to which

he had directed the laying a new Bridge higher up the Danube in the Neighbourhood of Salankement; and that 13 Battallions of 500 Men each, and a Company of 60 Grenadiers out of every Regiment, marched on the 4th out of Belgrade, cross'd the Save, and repair'd to the Camp at Semlin; where Felt-Marshal Kevenhuller was daily expected, to take on him the Command of the Cavalry. There is certain Advice of the Grand Vizier's being gone to Constantinople, and that the Turkish Army he commanded is separated. On Monday the 6th Instant, about Ten a-Clock in the Morning, the Grand Dutcheff of Tuscany was safely deliver'd of a Princess.

And Whereas John Carter, Francis Kellam, David Roberts, and Joseph Benson, against whom Informations have been taken upon Oath, have, since the Discovery of these Facts, left their Habitations, and absconded: His Majesty is pleased to promise the like Reward for the apprehending each of them, upon their or either of their being convicted; and, as a further Encouragement, is pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any Person who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices in the said Facts.
