By Letters of the roth I uftant from Count Konigfegg, which came by Express, we have Advice, that the whole Army was to march the next Day from Semlin, in order as is believed to refume the Operations of the 27th and 28th paft, by paffing the Save and the Danube again, and penetrating by Panchova into the Bannat, and this principally with a Defign to diflodge the Turks faid to be allembled at and near Vipalanka; while Prince Hildburghausen, with the Saxons and Bavarians, two Imperial Batallions, the two Regiments of Wirtenberg, and that of Toulon Dragoons, with two Re-giments of Cuirafliers Palfi and Bernes, to joyn all which 6000 Croatians are faid to be in march, shall remain to cover the Frontiers of Sclavonia, and particularly to fuccour Raticha. This last Place appeared, by Let-ters of the 8th, to have fuffered but very lit-tle from the Fire of the Enemy. Preparations are making for opening the next Campaign early: Orders are already given for buying up all the Corn that can be well spared in those adjacent Countries at a certain Price; and Inftructions are drawn up for a Plenipotentiary to go to feveral Courts of Germany to follicit Supplies of Men and Money. There feems to be no Doubt but that

the Great Duke of Tuscany and his Confort will make a Tour this Winter to Florence.

Kenfington, October 19. Joseph Benson, about 5 Foot 6 Inches high, between 60 and 70 Years old, stoops a little, wears a Wig, and his Hair pretty long under it, and is a thin spare Man, born near Naresborough in Yorkshire, by Irade a Gunsinith, noted for making Cross Bows, formerly lived in Dublin; his last Place of Habisation was at Cats-Hole in St. Catherine's, near the Tower. N. B. Joseph Benson is the Maker of the Engine lately found in the New River, and has made several Engines for milling the Guineas, and is reckoned by the Gunsths an ingenious Man at his Bussiels.
