

Crews or Merchandizes, and they shall pay their Tolls to our Guard Ship. For this Purpose we have given the necessary Orders that the Officers of our Guard Ship do give Notice to all Ships coming from Dantzick, Königsberg, and the Neighbouring Ports and Places abovementioned, that they may be instantly dispatched on board the Guard Ship, and may be supplied with what they may have Occasion for in their Voyage; but no Person on board such Ship shall be permitted to go ashore.

8. All Pilots, Fishermen, and others who have their Dwellings near the Sea, and more especially those of Drago, are expressly forbidden to go on board any one Vessel coming from the East Sea, much less to take into their Boats any of their Men or Merchandizes; but when such Ship has need of Pilots, then the Pilot with his own Boat shall go before to shew her the Way, and keep at some Distance when he speaks with the Men of the Ship. He shall take the Money that is due to him in a Dish or Cup with Salt Water therein.

We expressly forbid all whom it may concern, to act in any Point contrary to what is above, under Pain of Corporal Punishment. We charge our Vicar in our Kingdom of Norway, Counts, Grand Bailiffs, Bailiffs, Provincial Judges, Presidents, Magistrates, Mayors, and all others, to whom this our Ordinance shall be sent, under the Seal of our Chancery, to cause it forthwith to be read and published in the publick Places, to the End that all may be informed of it; and to see Obedience paid to it. Given at our Castle at *Friedericksberg* the 7th of *November* 1738. under our Royal Hand and Seal.

*Petersbourg*, Oct. 28. The 26th Instant the Prince of *Bevern* arrived here from the Army, and had the same Day the Honour to wait on her Czarish Majesty, who received him very graciously.

*Vienna*, Nov. 19, N. S. The Marquis de *Mirepoix*, the French Ambassador, having received full Powers from his Court, did Yesterday Sign, with one of the Imperial Ministers authorized for that Purpose, an Agreement which has been finally adjusted between the Emperor and France, with respect to the Court of *Turin*; and *M. de Solari*, the Sardinian Minister, is, pursuant thereto, to sign at *Paris* the final Accession of his Master to the Peace. It is said that *Marshal Wallis* has Orders to repair *Panchova*, if feasible, the razing of which Place was it seems against his Opinion. It is confidently reported that the Saxons are treating with the King of *Prussia* about the Pretensions of the Court of *Dresden* to the Succession of *Berques* and *Juliers*.

said threatening Letter, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so as they or any of them; be apprehended and convicted thereof HARRINGTON.

And as a farther Encouragement to such Discovery, *Francis Sorrell, Esq;* at the Office for Taxes in the *Exchequer, Westminster*, doth hereby promise a Reward of Thirty Guineas to any Person or Persons making the said Discovery, to be paid upon the Conviction of the Offender or Offenders. Whereas Information has been given upon Oath, That *Anthony Silk*, of *Peckham*, in the Parish of *Canterwell*, in the County of *Surry*, was on the Second of this Instant November, between the Hours of Five and Six in the Evening, violently assaulted in a Field, commonly called the *North Field*, in the Parish aforesaid, and wounded in a barbarous Manner, by two Persons unknown (one of them a tall Man, the other low of Stature, a third standing at a small Distance, supposed to belong to them) and robbed of Three Shillings in Silver, some Halfpence, and his Coat, Hat and Wig, &c. and left for dead: For the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Crimes, His Majesty is pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so as he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

N. B. And as a farther Encouragement to such Discovery, if any Person who has been an Accomplice in the said Robbery, shall, within Three Months from the Day the said Robbery was committed, discover and apprehend any Offender who hath committed the said Robbery, so as such Offender be convicted of the said Offence, such Accomplice will be intitled to have and receive for every such Offender so apprehended and convicted as aforesaid, the Sum of One Hundred Pounds Sterling, mentioned in His Majesty's Royal Proclamation, over and above all other Rewards to which such Accomplice may by any Act of Parliament be intitled: The said Robbery having been committed within Five Miles from the City of *London*.

Whereas the Post-Boy carrying the North Mail from *London*, was set upon and robbed by a single Person on Foot, this Morning between the Hours of Two and Three, on this Side *Kingland*, near *London*: The Postmaster General thinks proper to make it publickly known, That whoever shall apprehend the Person who committed this Robbery, will, upon Conviction, be entituled to a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds, besides the Reward by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen: Or if any Accomplice in the said Robbery, shall make a Discovery of the Person who committed the Fact, such Accomplice will be entituled to the said Reward of Two Hundred Pounds, and also have his Majesty's most gracious Pardon. The Person who committed this Robbery, is described to be a middle-sized Man, had on a light-colour'd close bodied Coat, with close Sleeves, and a full Bob Wig pretty light, with a Paper Mask over his Face. He carried off the five following Bags, viz. *Hartford*, *Peterborough*, *Horncastle*, *Louth*, and *Boston*; and likewise took the greatest Part of the Letters out of the *Enfield*, *Ware*, *St. Ives*, and *Roylton* Bags.

Note, There were two Men at a small Distance from him suppos'd to be his Accomplices.
