IS Polifh Majelty fince his Recovery has been pleafed to appoint the Cardinal of Cracow Archbishop of Gnessar, and confequently Primate of the Republick; and M. Szembeck Bishop of Cujavia succeeds his Emissence in his Diorele of Cracow.

Vienna, Dec. 24, N.S. M. Pibrac, who lately dame hither from the Elector of Cologne, to negociate a Convention for lending a Body of Troops to the Emperour, let out last Night for his Court, after having concluded and figned, as it is faid, an Agreement for two Regiments confisting of 2300 Men each.

Copenhagen, Dec. 27. By the Accounts we have here, the Plague feems to fpread towards Vienna, and full more towards the Turkish Dominions; but does not at all approach this way from the Frontier of Poland. There is not the least Suspicion of its being yet come to any Port on the Baltick; and the City of Dantzick, we hear, is extremely attentive to keep it from thence. Nevertheles the Ordinance for Quarantain is still observed here.

Berlin, Dec. 30, N. S. The King of Prussia's Indisposition is increased. Besides the Gout, it is faid his Prussian Majesty has a little Fever upon him, which confines him to his Bed.
